SUBJECT: Edward F. Weinheimer. Perjury

> In preparation for the trial of the captioned subject, George F. Callahan, Jr. was interviewed on February 2, 1960.

With reference to money which Mr. Callahan sent to Weinheimer in Des Moines, he advised that his best recollection is that he secured 10 one hundred dollar bills, placed plain white paper around the bills, and then placed the wrapped bills in three No. 10 size envelopes.

With reference to the cash sent to Detroit, Mr. Callahan utilized the same procedure except that only two No.10 size envelopes were sent and they contained \$1,000 in one hundred dollar bills.

Based upon this information, it is requested that through your sources at the Post Office you similate the envelopes, paper and cash in order to determine the weight of such envelopes and what postage was required in 1957 for their mailing.
