and Investigations, and the Bureau of Criminal Identification, both of the New York City Police Department, were checked and no record was located for the subject.

Information available in the NYO also indicates that ROGER LOVETT NOWLAND, and Mrs. ROSEALINE SCHLADERMUNDT NOWLAND, were the subjects of a POLICE COOPERATION-FOREIGN MISCELLANEOUS ~~INQUIRY~~ made at the NYO in 1957.

Investigation was conducted as a result of an inquiry by the Government of Belgium, regarding the reputations of the above, as they had been appointed Administrator and Manageress, respectively, of Nowland and Company, S.A., Belgium. (u) (2)

On 9/27 and 10/3 respectively, the records of the Bureau of Special Services and the Bureau of Criminal Identification, both of the New York City Police Department, were checked concerning captioned individuals, but no information identifiable with them was located.

On 10/2/57, the records of the Credit Bureau of Greater New York, were checked concerning the NOWLANDS and a report dated 4/20/54, concerning ROGER L. NOWLAND was made available. This report indicated that NOWLAND had resided at Old Long Ridge Road, Stamford, Conn. since 1945. The report described him as being about 47 years old, married, and the father of two children. He was further described as being a partner in the firm of Nowland and Schladermundt, 205 E. 42nd St., NYC.

Investigation in this case in NY is continuing as a result of information set out in the Legat, Havana letter to the Director, dated 6/11/58.

Extra copies of this letter are being sent to the Bureau for forwarding to the Legat, Havana, and copies are being sent for information to the Miami and Salt Lake City Offices, in view of interest by those offices in individuals mentioned in this letter.
