RevFO21rtel 6/3/63, captioned "CRIMINAL INTELLIGENCE PROGRAM" setting forth info furnished by WF 1108-C that subject and associates planned to move their dice game from Washington, D.C., to St. Mary's County, Md., and that ALLEN FISHER, well-known Lexington Park, Md., gambler was negotiating the proposed site; and Baltimore telphone call to WFO 6/6/64, advising confidential info received subject and associates had obtained a building in rear of Sportsman's Restaurant, Route 5, St. Mary's County, Md., and they planned to start dice game in very near future.

On 6/7/63, FF 1108-C advised SA JOHN R. BUCKLEY that on 6/6/63, dice equipment had been moved from Washington, D.C., to a shack located directly in the rear of Sportsman's Restaurant, located Route V.S. 5, just over the county line in St. Mary's County, Md. Informant doscribed dice table as a permanent mahogany, Las Vegas type, approximately 12' by 5', very heavy and costing about \$2,500.00. He said this table had been used for about one wook in the Amber Club's operation, Washington, D.C., 1962, and the table is not constructed in a manner that it can be speedily disassembled.
