NOTE:

Captioned subject was allegedly responsible for the arrest in Panama of Gabriel Gregorio Rodriguez, a Cuban alien who was suspected of plotting against the Torrijos Government in Panama. Rodriguez was arrested by Panamanian authorities and upon interview admitted his participation in efforts to raise money for a possible coup against the Panamanian Government. Rodriguez was sentenced to five years imprisonment during late November, 1974. Information was received indicating Rodriguez would be released and returned to the United States. Panamanian authorities requested advice as to whether Rodriguez was wanted in the United States.

NOTE CONTINUED:

A warrant for Rodriguez's arrest is outstanding at Bergen County, New Jersey, charging him with fraud. However, when contacted, Bergen County indicated that although they had a warrant for Rodriguez, they would not request his informal deportation or extradition from Panama inasmuch as the principal witness against Rodriguez is uncooperative.

On 12/9/74 Panamanian authorities indicated that they are considering deporting Rodriguez from the country and would put him on the plane for Miami in the near future.

SA Willis Walton, Miami Office, was orally advised by SA V. H. Nasca on 12/18/74 to alert INS, Miami.
