SJ T-2 is RAUL FERNANDEZ SILVA, Manager, Occidental Life, Room 312, Imparcial Building, San Juan, Puerto Rico (Protect by Request.) (U)

Local dissemination is being made to ONI, OSI, INTC, INS, Coast Guard and Customs.

[SJ T-2, RAUL FERNANDEZ SILVA,] advised that Comandos L left the Dominican Republic at the request of "U. S. Government Officials" and had entered an agreement with certain "U. S. Government Officials" whereby Comandos L agreed not to launch any attacks on vessels at sea. Also Comandos L agreed not to launch attacks from the sea on vessels berthed in Cuban ports. Attacks on these vessels from land was not prohibited in the agreement. In return for compliance with these restrictions, Comandos L would be allowed to enter Florida ports with their mother ship for the purpose of securing fuel and provisions.
