COMANDOS L INTERNAL SECURITY - CUBA NEUTRALITY MATTERS

SJ T-1, a Cuban exile residing in San Juan who is not a member of Comandos L but who is knowledgeble concerning certain activities of that group, furnished the following information on October 26, 1965:

the leader of the Comandos L group at

Mayaguez, Puerto Rico, recently moved from Mayaguez, to San Juan,

Puerto Rico. After arriving in San Juan disassociated

himself with the Comandos L group due to a disagreement between

and the Comandos L leader in Miami, Florida.

The other members of Comandos L who were in Mayaguez with recently departed Puerto Rico to go to Miami for the purpose of bringing a recently acquired "mother ship" to Puerto Rico. The "mother ship" was expected to arrive in San Juan at any time. On the ship's arrival, all remaining equipment belonging to Comandos L, including two small boats will be loaded aboard the "mother ship" and the "mother ship," along with all operational personnel of Comandos L in Puerto Rico, will depart for international waters off the coast of Florida.

The two small boats belonging to Comendos L are currently located at residences in Urbanizacion Los Angeles and Ocean Park.
