The authorities did, however, recover a case of what they referred to as "codes" from Williams Island, a copy of which was passed to the Miami Coast Guard Intelligence Officer, Lt. Rogers. to the authorities in the Bahamas, the Coast Guard Service seemed to know a lot about the raid of 18th March, and amongst other things, had a photograph of the ALISAN, the vessel from which the operation was conducted. It may be of interest to you to know that there has been aerial patrolling of the Cay Sal and Andros area which, up to 5th May, at least, revealed no sign of any occupation by anti-Castro forces.
