DE FUGH is reported to have said there was a squad of MM in Denver. DN T-1 reported that after reading about the group in 1961, he wrote to DE FUGH and was accepted as a member. T-1 continues to receive MM literature and its publication "On Target" but has attended no meetings. HAROLD C. TAYLOR, Denver, after reading about the organization, joined MM and received material but attended no meetings. TAYLOR broke off with MM in 1962. JAMES T. SMITH, Denver, joined MM in 1961, but later disassociated himself with the organization. on 9/13/63 furnished information that MM was anti-Semitic. A Prichard, Ala., businessman received a letter signed by "MORT EUTENEUER," purportedly mailed from Denver, 1/8/64, requesting his support for MM. Sources believe there is a group of MM presently active in Colo. Sources of opinion that this group includes a gunsmith student named PHILLIP PETARS; an accordion teacher named CHARLES E. T-l advised that some time in 1962, DE PUGH contacted him telephonically and urged him to assist in setting up a meeting in Englewood, Colorado. DE PUGH also invited T-l to visit the MM headquarters near Kansas City.

T-l reports that he still receives, through the mail, literature distributed by the MM but has never attended any meetings of the MM in Denver or anywhere else in the United States. T-l advised that dues to the MM are \$4.00 per year; however, DE PUGH has made requests for contributions for various causes during the period 1962 and 1963.

HAROLD C. TAYLOR, 2513 South Quitman Street, Denver, advised on February 3, 1964, that in August or September, 1961, he corresponded with DE PUGH as a result of reading an advertisement in a local newspaper. He stated that the advertisement had to do with securing a catalog on guns. TAYLOR stated he was interested in collecting guns and had no interest in any political activities of the MM. TAYLOR stated he did not secure from DE PUGH any guns of any type and, after receiving some literature from MM, he decided to disassociate himself with the organization and wrote a letter to DE PUGH requesting that his name be removed from DE PUGH's mailing list. TAYLOR stated he recalls receiving a letter from DE PUGH right after he joined MM to help organize a group in Denver but because of his disinterest in the aims of the MM he did not make any effort for such an organization and did not attend any meetings whatsoever held in Denver or anywhere else in the United States.
