Administrative Data

Confidential Source DOMINGO ROCHE advised he printed 1,000 envelopes for the Dominican Revolutionary Union but did not print chance books for that organization.

The Spanish language newscaster in the details of the report is Confidential Source DOMINGO ROCHE, whose name was not set forth in order to further protect his identity. ROCHE advised that LUIS PENA actually suggested that he, ROCHE, tape PENA's telephonic conversation in order that it would appear that the telephone calls were coming from the Dominican Republic.

The translation from "El Imparcial" was conducted by SA GENTRY LOWE.

PH T-2 (PCI [redacted]) advised that the elderly woman who was solicited for funds by LUIS PENA was his grandmother and, because of the delicacy of the situation, he did not wish to identify her or have her interviewed.

Careful consideration has been given to each source concealed and T symbols were utilized in this report only where necessary.
