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
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

When he was about geedy to leave he sent a telegram to Mata of the abovementioned address. He stated he did not recall the contents of the telegram, but was certain he off . Letate he was teaming Spain with instructions for Meic. arrival in seto, Belgium, subject accempted to lease hath Mata Muley through the Cuban Embassy theres but was unsuccessful. He stated he sent Moto a second telegram at the same address.

but received no response. The Cuban Ambassador to Belgium then personally drove him to Liege and the two of them anaged to locate Mata in a bar in the Spanish colony in eye. Subject stated that after he met Mata, the latter rockeed him to Muley. He admitted that the three of them used Spain and its problems and that both Mata and told him they were actively engaged in fighting Franco. Directorio Revolucionario Iberico de Liberacion (DRIL) ad subject believed that Muley was one of the directors Subject stated he remained in Liege for about cays visiting individuals who resided in the Spanish There. He was suddenly arrested, placed in jail a satened with return to Spain. It was the subject's that the Franco government put pressure on the Umbassy in Brussels to have the Brussels police in and place him in jail. Subject stated that hit three days the Cuban Government lodged an demplaint with Belgian authorities and arrangements to expel him from the country.

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Subject stated that he went by plane from Brussels to Paris, France, and remained there for about fifteen days during which time he lived at the home of an employee at the Cuban Embassy. He stated that during this time he visited the Spanish president in exile who lived in Paris. He stated that when his vacation in Paris was nearly completed he attempted to arrange for return to Cuba by way of United States, but could not do so. He finally obtained airline tickets for a return flight by way of Lisbon, Portugal, Santa Maria in the Azores and from there to Cuba. Subject stated he spent six days in Santa Maria waiting for the Madrid-Havana plane. While there, he stated that Portuguese authorities examined him very closely.

Im commenting on his European trip, subject stated the trip had no intelligence or espionage aspect or significance. He stated that he made the trip solely to visit relatives in Spain and to vacation for a few days in Belgium and France. He emphatically denied going to Europe to carry out anti-Franco activities or any activities connected with DRIL. In addition, the subject denied any connection whatsoever with the seizure of the "Santa Maria" in January, 1961, and has stated he had never heard of Galvao.

For your information, the subject, upon interview, described himself as being bitterly anticommunist.
