Since the closing of Expo 67, the Cuban Nationalist Movement (CNM) has primarily concentrated its activities on the Cuban Mission to the UN and its personnel. [The CNM had a plan to assassinate Ricardo Alarcon, the Cuban ambassador to the UN, which it wanted to carry out by the weekend of December 30-31, 1967; however, no attempt was made to assassinate Alarcon at that time.]

In addition, the CNM has a plan to disrupt by the use of explosives, a meeting of a rival anti-Castro group scheduled to be held on January 28, 1968 in Miami, Florida.

We have received no current information indicating that the CNM and/or Movimiento Insurreccional de Recuperacion Revolucionaria (MIRR) plan to attack targets in Canada. Both groups, however, continue to have the capability of planning and carrying out such attacks. The fact that we have no information indicating they currently have no plans to carry out such attacks should not be construed to mean that they

will not carry out such attacks. While we have a number of sources in a position to furnish information concerning the activities of these groups, it is possible for them to plan and carry out such attacks without our knowledge.

It is noted that the CNM has periodically indicated that it would strike at Communists and communist installations in any part of the world whenever the opportunity presented itself.

As in the past, all information received by us concerning plans of anti-Castro exiles, particularly the CNM and the MIRR, to attack targets in Canada will be immediately brought to the attention of the appropriate Canadian authorities. (C)

NOTE:

RCMP Criminal Investigation Branch Officer advised Canadian government is re-evaluating the overall question of security of Cuban establishments in Canada. The Department of External Affairs has requested views of RCMP. RCMP representative advised he realized FBI could not be expected to make any suggestions or recommendations, but in view of the Bureau's excellent coverage in the past, he would appreciate a current assessment of activities and targets of the CNM and MIRR as related to Canada. (S)

Any data provided by the Bureau will be appropriately paraphrased and the Bureau will not be named as source. A meeting in this matter is tentatively scheduled for 1/18/68. (S)

On 1/3/68, Supt. NADON, Criminal Investigation Branch Officer, RCMP Headquarters, said the Canadian Government is re-evaluating the overall question of security of Cuban establishments in Canada and the Department of External Affairs has requested views of the RCMP in this request. Supt. NADON said he realized the FBI could not be expected to make any suggestions or recommendations which would effect Canadian Government decision, but in view of Bureau's excellent coverage in this field in the past, he would appreciate a current assessment of activities and targets of the CNM and SMIRE as relates to Canada. (S)

As a meeting is tentatively scheduled for 1/18/68, he requested this matter be treated with some urgency and assured the Legat that any information received would be appropriately paraphrased and Bureau not named as source. (S)
