ReBusirtel 3/4/68 which alerted recipients to the possibility that Cuban intelligence has source who is providing information concerning activities of captioned anti-Castro group CAlso reButel 3/12/68 metting forth information from Legat, Ottawa, concerning alleged plans of Cuban exiles to take reprisals in Ottawa, Montreal, and Toronto, Canada, in retaliation for incident which recently took place off Virginia coast involving the Cuban vessel "26th of July." This data was furnished to the Canadians by the Cuban Ambassador to Canada.

MYtel 3/13/68 reported information received from NY 5938-5 which is similar to that provided to the Canadian authorities. In essence the New York data concerned plans of captioned group and MIRR, another milmant anti-Castro group, to attack a Cuban ship in a Canadian harbor as retaliation for the incident involving the above-mentioned Cuban vessel. The informant indicated that the exiles were endeavoring to obtain maps of St. Johns, Ottawa and Montreal. In view of the foregoing, it would appear that the Cuban Intelligence Service (CIS) has possibly penetrated the captioned group, and/or the MIRR and is in a position to obtain information concerning the activities of these groups.

Since we know that Cuban intelligence has targeted the captioned organization, we cannot dismiss the matter lightly with the thought that it was a chance bit of information obtained by the Cubans. We must assume that they have a good source who is providing current information. It is our job to identify this individual. Accordingly, recipient offices will carefully review their files on the members, sympathizers and associates of the captioned organization and the MIRR in an effort to pinpoint any individual who might be providing information concerning the activities of these groups to Cuban intelligence. Recipient offices also review the files of any other exile organizations and/or other individuals who because of their close association with the captioned group and MIRR would be in a position to obtain information concerning their activities as well as the files of informants, confidential sources and sources of information who are providing information concerning these organizations to see if any of these individuals might be providing information to Cuban intelligence. If the afore-mentioned review reveals that an individual is suspected of such activity, the Bureau should be promptly advised and a separate investigation initiated.

When the above-mentioned reviews have been completed recipient offices, except Ottawa, will furnish their comments, observations and recommendations as to what further steps can be taken in an effort to pinpoint individuals who may be furnishing information to Cuban intelligence. Handle promptly and keep Bureau currently apprised of pertinent developments.

Ottawa expeditiously furnish results of RCMP interview of the Cuban Ambassador so that full details concerning this matter will be available. (5)
