1. During a 16 December 1970 debriefing of Dynallectron Corporation Chairman Jorge Carnicero, Ben Smith raised with him once again the matter of his agreement to [redacted] particularly for WH/4, (Robert Feldman). 24

2. Carnicero visited Argentina and Chile in late November 1970 and Argentina only in early December 1970. During the first of these visits, he had to return to the US earlier than intended and, in fact, had only four hours' notice before his departure. During his second visit he found that he could not get a plane reservation for late Monday, as he had planned, and was forced to leave on a Sunday. In both cases he had intended to contact [redacted] Tom Polgar.

3. Both Antonio Lanuse and Alvaro Alcega have expressed a desire to attend a luncheon with Polgar at Carnicero's Buenos Aires apartment. Carnicero has been prevented by the press of business from completing arrangements for this meeting, but promised to do so when he returns to Buenos Aires in mid-January 1971. Smith impressed upon Carnicero the need to arrange a luncheon with Mrs. Roberto Noble, of Clerin, as well.

4. Following the suggestion made by Feldman in a recent telecon, Smith will not again raise the point of arranging these meetings for Polgar, but will, reluctantly, assume that Carnicero is just too busy to follow up on his [redacted]
