0000 ()September 19, 1968 advised that <u>Robert Martin AAPHAEL</u>, Montreal, Quebec, a member of the <u>Socialist</u> <u>Labour League</u> (Ligue Socialiste Ouvriere) (L.S.O. - Trotskyist) had received a leaflet on the Congress of Black Writers Conference scheduled to be held at the Stephen Leacock Bldg., and the Student Union Bldg., McGill University, Montreal, Que., from October 11 to October 14, 1968. The leaflet outlined the program of the Conference to be dedicated to the late Rev. Martin Luther KING and Malcolm X, as follows: \$4.00 Cost of Registration: Towards the Second Emancipation of the Dynamics of Program: Black Liberation. Origins and Consequences of the Black-White Conference with <u>C.L.R. JAMES</u> and <u>Alvin POUSSIN</u>. The "Terms" of the Modern Black Awareness with C.L.R. 2. JAMES and Robert HILL. Re-evaluation from the Past - (in French) by Rene 3. DEPESTRE. Civilizations of Ancient Africa by Richard MOCRE. 4. Contribution of the Afro-American and American to 5. American History in Civilization by Leroi JONES. Aacial Discrimination in Britain by Richard SMALL. ε. An Evening of Soul Music. 7. Black Power in U.S. by Stokley CABMICHAEL. 8. Black Revolution 3rd World Capitalism by Eldridge 9. CLEAVER and James FOREMAN. 10. 3 Hours for Resolutions. Editorial: "It is in this context, this Congness of Black Writers hopes to make its contribution. Here for the 1st time in Canada an attempt will be made to recall, in a series of popular lectures by vast scholars, artists and politicians, the history which we have been taught to forget. The history, the Blackman's own response, in thought and in action to the conditions of his existence in the New World." C.L.R. JAMES, Negro; Alvin POUSSIN; Robert HILL, List of Names: Jamaican; Rene DEPESTRE, Haitian; Richard MOORE, from Barbados; Leroi JONES; Richard SMALL, Jamaican; Stokley CARMICHAEL, Negro; Eldridge CLEAVER from Little Rock, Arkansas; James FOREMAN; and Rocky JONES from Truro, Nova Scotia.

2. JAMES, POUSSIN, HILL, MOORE, DEPESTRE, JONES, CARMICHAEL, and CLEAVER were mentioned in our letter of September 18, 1968 concerning this Conference. James FOREMAN is believed identical to James FORMAN, an executive member of the Student Non-Violence <u>Co-ordinating Committee</u> in the United States. We have no identifiable reference on Richard SMALL. Rocky JONES, identical to Burnley Allan JONES of Halifax, Nova Scotia, is a prominent Canadian militant leader and organizer in the Halifax Negro community.
