and Techniques of the National Liberation Front of South Vietnam, by Douglas PIKE, and in the June/July 1966 issue of Viet Report under Open Letters, HAYDEN was author of an article entitled "A Protest Against the Draft and Intellect." He is also the author of a book entitled Rebellion in Newark published by Vintage Books, which contends that the Newark riots in July 1967 were the Negro response to "the original and greater violence of racism" by whites. HAYDEN co-authored an article which appeared in the Fall 1967 issue of the American Scholar, Vol. XXXVI, No. 4.

3. The files of this Agency contain the following information on HAYDEN. He attended the International Cultural Congress held in Cuba on 5 January 1968. One Tom HAYDEN, an editor of the Southern Patriot, attended a three-day conference of the Nonviolent Coordinating Committee in Atlanta, Georgia during May 1962.

JOHNSON, Edward - He was one of the American prisoners released to HAYDEN in November 1967.

KING, Martin Luther Dr. (201-760966) - They were members of a committee to handle the case of three American prisoners, 1967.

LYND, Staughton (201-797227) - They were in contact many times during 1966 and 1967, probably regarding the anti-Vietnam movement.

MEEROPOL, Michael Allen (no 201) - He is the oldest son of Julius and Ethel Rosenberg (201-1595). He and HAYDEN are close friends.

MCELDOWNEY, Carol (201-8276775) - Correspondence addressed to her was sent in care of Thomas HAYDEN, CA 1968.

* OANH, Do Yuan - (Possibly identifiable with OANH Do Zuan (201-823818) who was visiting France in July 1967.) OANH was the contact between HAYDEN and exiled Vietnamese in France, August 1967.

PITZER, Daniel Lee - He was one of the American prisoners released to HAYDEN in November 1967.

RING, Harry (201-311823) - Both traveled to Cuba in December 1967.

ROUSSOPOULOS, Dimitri (201-820105) - HAYDEN met with him while in Montreal, August 1967.
