- 1. Field Comment. In January 1966 Masferrer told a group of Cuban emigras in Miami that Father Georges was one of those contributing financial support to a plan for invading Haiti. See TDCSDB-315/00225-66.
- 2. Source Comment. Masferrer was probably exaggerating. He may have equipment for 250 men.

### Field Comments

- 3. Maeferrer has previously claimed that he had the support of the Dominican Government.
- 4. Another source has reported on plans for making a film purporting to show efforts of Haitians to overthrow President Duvalier. See UFG-0588.
