According to other information reported in the same reference, Andrew St. George, a free-lance photographer, had received permission from Masferrer to make a film for the Columbia Broadcasting System concerning the activities of the Masferrer group with respect to an invasion of Haiti to be mounted from the Dominican Republic. See also TDCSDB-315/02006-66, 22 September 1966, which reported on plans for moving the schooner POOR RICHARD from Ocean Reef, north Key Largo, Florida, to Dinner Key Marina, in Miami; and the association of St. George and Mitchell Livingston Werbell III with the vessel. Werbell was described as a person involved with various anti-Castro personalities. The source of the report commented that it was believed that Masferrer was also connected with the vessel.
