1. Following a review of Subject's file, we believe Headquarters has copies of all of our information. Attached herewith is AMOT report CC-1234 dated 7 June 1965 which contains extensive biographic information. You are also referred to HMMA-24080 dated 11 August 1964 for similar information.

2. The most recent AMOT information on VEGA is an LITAMIL-3 report dated 23 October 1966 which states VEGA had returned to Cuba from Mexico and had been appointed Director of International Relations of the Cuban National Council on Culture.

1. The following information was obtained from ^{05 08} Pedro ROEJ Ortega ⁰⁸ Former ⁰⁸ [Commercial] Representative of the Cuban Government accredited in Mexico. Graduate of the School of Espionage and Counter-Espionage in Havana in ⁰⁸ [1962].

a. Source met Manuel Eugenio VEGA Pérez, aka "Barcos," in the month of August or September 1961. In those days, VEGA Pérez was an instructor at the Officers Academy of the Castro regime and was also teaching an intensive course on espionage and counter-espionage to the future agents of the Castro regime in Latin America.

b. VEGA Pérez is white, was born circa 1919 in the City of Havana, is about 5'10" tall, about 190 lbs., has dark brown hair, is single, and, according to source, is a homosexual. He is a close friend of Manuel PINERO Lozada, aka "Barba Roja."

c. According to source, Foreign Service and Prensa Latina personnel graduated from the School or Academy of Espionage. VEGA Pérez arrived in Mexico as Cultural Attaché of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico. However, at that time there were too many Cultural Attachés so VEGA Pérez was appointed as Cuban Press Attaché in Mexico. One of VEGA Pérez' functions was to act as contact or liaison between the foreign representatives of another country who arrived in Mexico and the Castro regime.

d. In 1962, VEGA Pérez engaged in the purchase of photographic equipment and films to be distributed together with the Communist propaganda throughout Latin America. Between 1961 and 1962, VEGA Pérez was the Second Chief of the Center of all subversive, espionage and counter-espionage activities in Mexico.

2. The following information was obtained from the same source on Ramón César CUERCA Montoto, who is mentioned in paragraph 3.c. of your request dated 23 Oct 64. Source reported the following information on CUERCA Montoto:

a. Raulo Cesar CUERCA Montoto was introduced to source in Havana by a man named (fnu) MORTENAYOR who was an old member of the Spanish Communist Party. This MORTENAYOR was the Director of the Espionage School in Havana and was in charge of placing personnel in other countries.

b. MORTENAYOR told source that he would receive orders in Mexico from CUERCA Montoto, who was the sole person authorized by the Castro regime to give the instructions. CUERCA was doing very active espionage and counter-espionage work in Mexico, and was the man in charge of taking care of every important personage who passed through Mexico.

c. CUERCA Montoto was born circa 1936. He about 5'11" tall, about 190 lbs., has rather blond hair, is from Havana, and wears glasses constantly.

d. In 1962, CUERCA Montoto was acting as chief of the Consulates in Veracruz, Tampico and Tlax Masjeras, and, according to source, these were key Consulates for Communist subversion. CUERCA Montoto had close contact with a brother-in-law of Lázaro CÁRDENAS, former Mexican President, who was a peasant leader. Through that individual, he contacted various peasant leaders from different zones of the country, and CUERCA Montoto made a trip through the interior of the country for that purpose.

e. The following information was furnished by Pedro Rojas Ortega on Rogelio RODRIGUEZ López, who is mentioned in paragraph 5.a. of your request dated 23 Oct 64:

f. Rogelio RODRIGUEZ López was acting in Mexico as Second or Third Secretary of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico, and enjoyed the full confidence of the personnel attached to said Embassy. RODRIGUEZ López was a very close friend of the code clerk of the Embassy, and used to stay in the room where the code clerk deciphered the messages received.

g. RODRIGUEZ López is white, born circa 1935, about 5'10" tall, black hair, wears glasses constantly due to slight defect, and was married in 1962 (source does not remember the wife's name). According to source, RODRIGUEZ López had brownish tussocks and source doubts that RODRIGUEZ López is a Communist.

4. The following information was obtained from [redacted]

[redacted] Former Cubana Airlines official in Havana, who is now working for [redacted] at the Miami International Airport. PACIOS furnished the following information on Carlos Luis ALFONSO RUGA, who is mentioned in paragraph 5.c. of your request dated 23 Oct 64:

a. Carlos Luis ALFONSO RUGA was born circa 1924 in Havana, white, about 5'10" tall, about 170 lbs. He is an educated man and has an agile mind. Liked to live well and used to practice sports in the Miramar Yacht Club in the City of Havana.

b. From 1950 to 1954, ALFONSO RUGA was Cubana Airlines Traffic Supervisor. From 1954 to 1959 he was Station Chief. From 1959 to 1961 he was Assistant of the Traffic Chief, and in 1961 he was made Cubana Airlines Traffic Chief in Havana.

c. ALFONSO RUGA belonged to the so called confidential personnel of the CCA (Cubana Airlines), who did not belong to the union. In 1959, he joined the Castro regime and wore the militia uniform in Cubana Airlines.
