Non-immigration

1. The files of this office reflect that Nicolai Nicolaeovich KRIVANOVSKY and wife, Gladys Svetlana nee CONSTANTINE, stateless, formerly of Piontain, Piontain, and then of Rome, were applicants for immigration visas to the U. S. during August, 1952.

a. Nicolai Nicolaeovich KRIVANOVSKY listed the following relatives in connection with his application: Father, Nicolai Vasiliovich KRIVANOVSKY, no address shown; mother: Lydia P. trovna KRIVANOVSKY, 69 Via Palestro, Rome; sister: Irina Nicolaeovna KRIVANOVSKY, same address as mother; sister: Larisa Nicolaeovna KRIVANOVSKY, Villa Saffiere, Viale du Plateau, 4 Pointe Cardinale, Rome; daughter: Roma Nicolaeovna KRIVANOVSKY, no address shown.

b. Gladys Svetlana KRIVANOVSKY listed the following relatives in connection with her application: Father: James Thomas SHUTTS; mother: Mori YOSHIDA, c/o Mr. NISHIMURA, 523 Katas-cho, Ryomori-ku, Osaka, Japan; brother: George SHUTTS; and sister: Mrs. Marie WORMAN, 937 - 24th Avenue, San Francisco 10, California.

c. The KRIVANOVSKYS listed Mr. P.H.B. NEW, O.B.E., E. C., "Cloverings", Gordon Sea Road, Gordon, Dunfermline, England, as a character reference who is obviously identical with the applicants' character reference.

d. In connection with the file check completed by this office, the following information was furnished the Embassy at Rome in our memorandum dated 25 September 1952:

"It is noted that subject states that his father is deceased. Information dated 12 May 1947, evaluation C-3, indicates that one KRIVANOVSKY, Sam, an old man, was a gate watchman at the Soviet Consulate in Piontain.

"Information dated June 1946 mentions Iryna KRIVANOVSKAYA and her daughter, Larisa Popovna KRIVANOVSKAYA as self-appointed leaders of Russians during captivity in the Philippines. The mother and daughter contacted the Russian consulates when they arrived in Manila to attend the surrender of the Japanese, and gave parties for the Russian officers. At this time Larisa KRIVANOVSKAYA expressed her willingness to work for the Russian Consulate in Berlin, but was told by the consulate that she would be of more value if she could get to the United States. It is not possible to determine whether the above-mentioned women are in any way related to subject or his wife.

"Subject states that he was employed by the Carl Walter Company in Piontain. Information in our files dated September 1946 states that this company supplied Germany with such needed raw materials via Siberia up to the outbreak of the Russian war in June, 1941. This same document also states that one J. WELSH was a member of the Sport Shooting in Piontain, which group symbolized the more convinced national socialists.

"Subject indicates that he was once employed by a Mr. WALKIN at the Piontain Consulate. Information dated 20 January 1950, evaluation C-6, states that James WALKIN was a Soviet activist in Piontain, and a member of the Soviet Citizens Association, and that he was reported to be willing to admit in connection or approval of [redacted] [redacted]

KRIJANOVSKY, Clotys Svetlana ne CYSTANU (nee SKOTCHDOPOLE)

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"Information dated 21 October 1949, evaluation B-3, reflects that the Solomon Sergeyevich ALKIN was associated with I. G. SKOTCHDOPOLE, along the Soviet border. ALKIN was the proprietor of a pastry shop and his main interest was acting as a courier between Tsingtao, Tientsin, and Peiping.

"Information dated 7 November 1946, evaluated B-3, indicates that Pasquale DICHERIEZO, the manager of the Palladium Night Club, Tientsin, who employed subject from January 1946 to May 1946, was suspected of dealing in black market arms and ammunition."

2. The applicant and her husband, Nicholas KRIJANOVSKY, are presumed to be identical with the KRIJANOVSKYs referred to above who were applicants during 1952 at Rome. The records of this office do not indicate whether or not they were successful in obtaining visas on that occasion.

3. In addition to the information set forth in Para. 1, the following report is brought to your attention.

a. A report in the files of this office dated January, 1947, evaluated C-3, refers to the organization of the Soviet Citizens' Club in Tientsin. This report listed the names of officers and some members of the club. Among the members of the Managing Committee of the club was one N. N. KRIJANOVSKY (also shown as N. N. KRIJANOVSKY). AKO

(1) This report stated that, among the eleven members of the Managing Committee, at least two, Basil Ivanovich BOLENEV and SKOTCHDOPOLE, (AKO) were suspected of being then engaged in intelligence work on behalf of the Soviets, and at least two others, I. S. OURSEVICH and V. A. PARANOV, were suspected of having formerly engaged in intelligence activities on behalf of the Soviets.

b. Applicant lists as a character reference Mr. W. J. HOWARD, 8 Duke Street, Hong Kong.

a. The files of this office reflect that Arthur GOLDING, British, formerly of Liverpool, Britain, Victoria, B. C. and then of Hong Kong, was an applicant for a non-immigration visa to the U. S. during June 1954. He listed W. HOWARD, c/o A.R.C.I., No. 8 Duke Street, Hong Kong, as a character reference.

b. The files of this office failed to show any trace of Arthur GOLDING, but it was noted that he had previously been employed by the British-American Tobacco Company in Britain, a firm which was believed to have been established to provide a "cover" for Sino-British economic intelligence activities.

c. Arthur GOLDING listed his wife as Tatiana Petrovna GOLDING ^{TATIANA} and SKOTCHDOPOLE and stated that she had been employed by the Ice Storage Tobacco Company as of 1944. This company was believed to have served as a "cover" for the collection of economic and political intelligence for the British Intelligence Service.

d. The W. HOWARD mention in sub-para. (a) above is presumed to be identical with the Mr. W. J. HOWARD listed by the applicant.

e. The information set forth in sub-para. b. and c. above was furnished the Consulate at Hong Kong in the memorandum from this office dated 9 July 1954.

5. No investigation conducted.

6. P. H. KENT, Coodan Sea Rd., Sussex, England, was listed as a character reference on the immigration visa application of Alexandra PETERS nee CHERBAKOFF, British, formerly of Harbin, Weihai, Tientsin, and then of France (Paris?), when PETERS applied during March, 1953. The files of this mission reflected no trace of PETERS. P. H. KENT listed by PETERS, is presumed to be identical with the P.H.S. KENT, shown by KRIJANOVSKI on her application.

7. The information furnished in Para. 3 was extracted from a MI-TWIN memorandum to the files of this mission dated 3 January 1947 addressed to RH/1 from RH/86; subject: "Soviet Organizations, Tientsin - Soviet Citizens' Club". Source YTX-1.
