Pablo tells Teresa Proenza that a few days before, on a weekend, four persons came to him from California to see him. These four were interested in seeing her and going to Cuba. Among themselves they chose one to go to Mexico in the name of all four, as the others work and it would be difficult for them to go.

This woman, to whom Pablo gave a letter to Teresa, has good recommendations. Her husband is a professor of English and Spanish in the California school system, but for political reasons he lost his job more than a year ago. She was to give Teresa more information.

The other two persons who came to see him, Pablo says that he had known before, but not well. But he says that since they were good friends of the woman being sent to Mexico, he was sure they were good people.

To someone named Carlos Pablo sends more information. The woman should arrive in Mexico in a few days, and she has the name + address of Carlos.

Pablo has received no bulletins since his departure. He asks if any have been sent.

He says it has gotten cold in Arizona. He wanted to go to Mexico in fall but didn't have the necessary resources to go. He may go at the beginning of next year. Greetings to Teresa.
