Recent Developments in the Mexican Communist Party
Connection between La Voz de México and the Daily Worker

On April 18, 1946, this office was able to obtain a carbon copy of a letter prepared on the stationery of La Voz de México, the official organ of the Mexican Communist Party. The letter is dated April 16, 1946, and is signed by Azequiel de la Cruz, Manager. It is addressed to Coney Island C.P., Surf Ave. and 31 St., Brooklyn, N.Y., and is as follows:

"Dear Friends:

"For reasons which we cannot state our newspaper, 'The Voice of Mexico' has not been published for several months. We of the new management have undertaken publication under conditions of bankruptcy and debt. In order to resume publication and initiate a fund-raising campaign we are forced to make appeals to our friends in the United States.

"You can readily understand what it means to our people and our organization to be without a newspaper in these critical times. Please don't destroy this letter as just another appeal for funds, and see what you can do to aid us. Any contribution regardless of how small it may be may help us resume publication. Our address is Avenida 56, Mexico, D.F."

Also on April 18, 1948, this office intercepted a letter dated April 6, 1948, prepared on the stationery of the Daily Worker, New York City. The letter is addressed to Diposio ENCINA, Secretary General of the Mexican Communist Party, and is signed by John PITTMAN, Associate Editor. In his letter, PITTMAN explains that the Daily Worker was preparing a special May Day issue, one feature of which was to have been the growth of international working class solidarity against the offensive of Wall Street imperialism. PITTMAN in his letter to ENCINA requests that the latter individual immediately send by air mail a brief greeting to the American working class. A photostatic copy of this letter has been prepared and is being retained in the files of this office.
