GENERAL:

At Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

On 10 October 1960, Confidential Informant MI-36 was interviewed on the premises of the General Post Office at 30th and Market Streets. He made arrangements to open a post office box (\$4.50 quarterly fee) in the names of DANIEL and or MILDRED _____. The facility to be utilized is identified as: Post Office Box [redacted] General Post Office, Philadelphia 1, Pennsylvania. With respect to the written application for the facility, no references were required and no residence or business address was listed for the _____s.

At [redacted] Pennsylvania

On 11 October 1960, [redacted] Postmaster, was interviewed on the premises of the Post Office at the intersection of Center and North 7th Streets. This informant was alerted to the fact that if any mail should arrive for DANIEL and or MILDRED _____, it should be forwarded to Post Office Box [redacted] General Post Office, Philadelphia 1, Pennsylvania. MR. [redacted] was very cooperative and stated that he would take the necessary action to insure that any items would be forwarded as requested. He declared that he would have to advise the Assistant Postmaster, [redacted] of the request to make sure of proper handling.

As a matter of general interest, the current telephone directory for the village of [redacted] does not contain a listing in the name _____ and MR. [redacted] who described himself as a resident here all of his life, brought out that he does not recall anyone with the surname _____ ever residing here.
