

(Renewal)

1. The attached project, originating in WH Division, is presented for renewal for the period 1 December 1959 through 31 November 1960. The project provides for physical and photographic surveillance operations in support and exploitation of other Mexico City operations, particularly those targetted at Soviet personnel and installations.

- 2. Authority is requested to obligate \$84,910 from the DD/P-WH Division operating budget: \$43,435 for fiscal year 1960 and \$36,425 for fiscal 1961, subject to the availability of funds. These sums include \$61,910 compensation for five contract agents (three of whom serve as principal agents for segments of the project), and sixteen support agents; \$3,500 for vehicle maintenance and commercial carrier travel; \$7,500 for operational equipment; \$5,000 for maintenance of three safehouses; \$2,000 for additional safehouse, post office box, and vehicle rental (50,000 for the purchase of information, documents, paragraph of tribes, etc.
- 3. The attached request request, prepared in the Division and supported by a project review prepared in the Field, reviews the activities of the project during the past year and present a detailed breakdown of the funds requested. The project operates in three segments: (a) Contract agent Oliver G. SCANTLING is an independent asset who is used to follow-up and exploit operational information on target personnel and installations, to case various installations of interest, acquire property, etc.; (b) a photographic surveillance team, under principal agent Raymond H. GERENDE, utilizing three houses or apartments and one photo truck; and (c) a physical surveillance team under principal agent Simon D. CLACKETT, consisting of three trained members at the present time. The attached renewal request reviews the activities and accomplishments of the project objectives. trained CLACKETT in radio controlled mobile surveillance. SCANTLING also has rendered valuable support to the LITACIT operation having gained embry to the target under a fabri-cated cover. He has atsocased and prepared reports on the LITABBY target in hypebaration for future operations and performed investigations of humerous other Station targets of opportunity. He investigated many leads from other audiosurveillance operations enabling the Station to maintain current data on various Soviet contacts and resulting in a recruitment attempt which, while unsuccessful, is believed to indicate future potential along this line. He has further been used to develop radio procedures for the mobile teams and to rent various properties in support of other Station operations. The GERENDE segment, using three base houses for photography, produced upwards of 12,000 photographs during the year. One base has recently begun taking motion pictures of Soviet personnel in the course of conversation which have been forwarded to FI/D for possible exploitation by lip reading analysis. This segment also operates the mobile radio surveillance vehicles. A mobile photography surveillance truck has been used during the project year for coverage of various Station targets which do not warrant the establishment of permanent photographic bases. GERENDE has also served to rent post office boxes, hotel rooms, etc., in support of other Station operations. During the past project year CLACKETT, who returned to Mexico in early April 1959 after Headquarters training, spent the following two months being brained by SCANTLING in mobile surveillance techniques. He then undertook training of a four member team which was judged ready for operational use toward the end of the project year. Two additional contract agents, Wilma J. FIORDALISI and Louise J. MACRINO, performed translation and support functions.

Appropriate staff components concur in recommending renewal.

(b) \FI/OPS notes that while the project review presents a clear picture of the aims and objectives of the various segments, it does not provide, except in the case of SCANTLING, detailed indication of the value or usefulness of the other segments, particularly the photographic activity. FI/OrS requests that the Station provide such an appraisal during the first quarter of 1960. FI/OPS recommends strongly that the photo coverage be reviewed from the standpoint of value and usefulness with a view to determining whether the LILYRIC activity could not be safely eliminated and the additional photographic coverage conducted on a more selective basis, without materially affecting overall usefulness. FI/OPS notes materially affecting overall usefulness. FT/OPS notes that, in the absence of further proof of usefulness, the color photography and moving pictures appear to be an unnecessary luxury. FT/OPS commends the careful handling of the GLACKETT segment and requests that the next project action include examples of the team's progress.

5. I recommend renewal of Project LIEMPTY as presented with attention to the staff comments in paragraph 4 above.



- A. Oliver G. SCANTLING Segment (in relation to project objectives.)
- l. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical facilities." SCANTLING has continued to provide worthwhile information in support of this objective. (See previous project review forwarded by IMMA-20052 of 18 October 1962.) During the past year SCANTLING was used to follow up leads produced by both LIFEAT and LIENVOY in support of this objective. In particular SCANTLING provided, in blueprint detail, casing reports on the homes of two Soviet intelligence officers who are targets for Station technical operations.

SCANTLING also is used to aid the Station in maintaining current records of the residences of Soviet personnel living in Maxico. This is accomplished by SCANTLING's followup of LIENVOY leads which findicate Soviet interest in renting specific properties.

- 2. "To collect operational information pertaining to other targets of opportunity, foreign official installations and personnel of intelligence interest operating in Mexico." SCANTLING has proved successful in providing information on other Station targets:
 - c. SCANTLING obtained information on AMIQUELET-2, a suspect Soviet support agent which was the basis of further Stadion operations against this target.
 - b. SCANTLING provided a casing of the former Yugoslev Commercial Office against which the Station had planned a technical operation. However, this site was evacuated by the target mission before plans were completed for this attempt.
 - c. SCANTLING has conducted detailed investigations in various cases involving possible agents or contacts of hostile intelligence services. These cases were of prime donceum to Station Mentico but frequently were unlestaken at the request of Headquarters or other Stations.
- 5. To provide support to their Decastons as may be expressed by the Station officers condermed. In the past CLMTITING's activities in this area were concurred primarily with retruitments, tabriblings and surveillances. In support of the Station's harassment campaign against Juan Jose AREVALO Bermejo, launched at the request of Headquarters, SCANTLING again provided the means for carrying out a large portion of the action taken. SCANTLING's efforts ranged from the mailing of "poisoned" candy to the target to the placing of threatening phone calls. SCANTLING also made calls to various Mexican newspapers and mailed "montage" pictures of AREVALO and a Soviet intelligence officer to Guatemalan newspapers in the campaign to discredit and discourage AREVADO in the Guatemalan Presidential campaign.

SCANTLING is used as the literate contactin a sensitive LAURICLE project. This is for the purpose of minimizing the danger of the action agent in this project being recognized as being in contact with an obvious PERRIMS STIVEN. SCANTLING's contribution to this operation has been worthy both from the standpoint of security and agent handling.

d. SCANTLING continued to conduct numerous pretext and neighborhood investigations. As in the past many of these investigations were in relation to highly sensitive cases.



Although SCANTLING's LIEMPTY project objectives can not be completely fulfilled, it is the Station's opinion that SCANTLING continues to make valuable contributions to the objectives of the project and to other Station activities. SCANTLING's production, measured against monetary expenditure, case officer time and other intangibles factors, unquestionably justifies his continuing as an integral part of Project LIHMPTY.

- 5. "To provide operational support to Station operations including the renting of hotel rooms and safe apartments, renting and servicing of post office boxes, and conducting counter-surveillances." GERENDE's contribution to the AMROD operation was noted in paragraph I.A.J.a. above. GERENDE's comprehensive area knowledge and personal operational capabilities enable him to make a valuable contribution in such operations as AMROD and also enable him to procure the most desireable safe sites in support of the Station's operations. The project's assets, particularly GERENDE and LIEMPTY-10, presently provide 20 post office box mail drops for use of Mexico City Station and other Stations. Although it is planned to reduce this number considerably during the next year, (since other Station assets now can provide a number of live accommodation addresses), a number of post office boxes viall be retained for use in future operations.
- h. The quality and quantity of operational information produced by the photographic bases and other activities under GENENDE's control and supervision is considered by the Station worthwhile and in some cases unique. It is concluded, therefore, that this segment of the LIFAPTY Project should be continued.

C. Relationship to the Related Mission Directive

As noted in the examples given above, Project LIEMPTY has provided valuable support to many Station operations and thereby has been a contributing factor to the fulfillment of the Related Mission objectives of the Station. The project has not produced any positive intelligence nor is it intended to do so. The project's sols purpose is to provide a mechanism for the development of operational information.

T. CHATTES

The one rajor change made in the LIEMPTY Project was the replacement of CERTIDE by SCANTLING as cutout with the SIMITED basehouse. Station does not plan to request cancellation of her operational clearance at the time, but has not included salary payments to her in the estimated costs of the projection the coming year.

The unusual satural transfer reflected for LIEMPTY-19 in the "Project Costs" (below) section for the coming year is due to this agent's new duties of LIFEAT processing in addition to her old duties as translator. Agent's OA was amended for this use on 2 January 1963.

III. EFFECTIVENESS

The comments made concerning the project's effectiveness in the Project Renewal of 1960 (HMMA 15979) remain valid. Indeed the Station's need for the type of services provided by the assets of this project are at least as great today as they were when those comments were originally forwarded.

IV. PROBLEMS

There are presently no known major problems facing the operation which would affect either the security or the effectiveness of this operation. The security problem facing the LICALLA portion of the operation and described in HMMA-15979 and subsequent renewal requests has been resolved by the Cuban Government's release of three KURIOT personnel earlier whis year. As was noted previously, one of this group had knowledge of the HICALLA operation.

Both SCANTLING Photographic took the bound the month of October 1963. No security problems were revealed by this test.

V. PLANS

The Station considers that the project is operating at its optimum size and does not plan to expand it during the coming year. Efforts will be continued to refine and better utilize the existing project organization and to improve the compartmentation and security of the project.

VI. COSTS

Past Project Year - Station records show that Project LIEMPTY expended approximately JUS 30,680.00 during FY 1965 (1 December 1962 - 30 June 1963) and has to date in FY 1964 (through 30 September 1965) carrieded JUS 7,620. This will make a total expendent for the project year of about JUS 48,600 or SUS 1,300 under that which the latted for this project.





Review of Project LIEMPTY
For the purpose of Project Renewal)

I. CURRENT OBJECTIVES AND PRODUCTION

A. Oliver G. SCANTLING Segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):

1. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical facilities." SCANTLING has continued (see previous Project Reviews forwarded as attachments to HMMA-17999, 31 October 1961, HMMA-14093, 13 November 1959, and HMMA-15979, 18 November 1960) to provide worthwhile information pertaining to this objective. During the past year SCANTLING has continued to be used extensively to follow up leads produced by LHEAT and LIENVOY. An excellent example of this blending of various Station support assets was the investigation and casing performed by SCANTLING after leads from both LIENVOY and LIFEAT indicated the possibility of launching a successful technical operation against the residence off a high ranking LIMERICK intelligence officer assigned to Mexico under diplomatic cover. With the aid of the thorough casing report and neighborhood investigation completed by SCANTLING, Station KURIOT personnel, supported by other Station support assets, were successful in installing a technical device in the target.

SCANTLING continues to be the Station's primary means of keeping current records on the residences of the many Soviet personnel in Mexico City. This is primarily accomplished through SCANTLING's follow up of all LIENVOY leads which indicate interest by Soviets in specific quarters. (See previous project renewal requests for additional details.)

2. "To collect operational information pertaining to other targets of opportunity, foreign official installations and personnel of intelligence interest operating in Mexico". SCANTI AND Person useful for collecting information on other Station targets:

A. On the basis of a lead from the ODACID installation in Veracruz, the Station (with Headquarters support) mounted an operation to unobtrusively salturate a large unit of agricultural machinery (of U.S. origin) which was in transit to Cuba. To mount this operation, a precise and detailed casing of the implement was essential. This SCANTLING was able to accomplish in one trip to Veracruz with results that contributed substantially to the operation.

- b. SCANTLING provided the Station a detailed investigation of Harotun ("Harry") KOPOIAN, employee of American Communists Albert and Margaret MALTZ, which determined the residence of KOPOIAN as well as his family status and connections.
- c. In the Satellite area, SCANTLING completed a casing of an official Yugoslav installation in conjunction with a projected Station technical operation.
- 3. "To exploit operational leads through recruitments, debriefings, and surveillances." SCANTLING has contributed to this objective both directly and indirectly as noted in the following examples:
 - a. SCANTLING completed a detailed and secure interview of the fiancee of BESMOOTH to determine her connection with the principals in the MCMAYFOWL case, particularly any connection with procurement of documents used in the flight behind the Iron Curtain. This assignment was extremely sensitive (SCANTLING was not told true reason for interview) and SCANTLING did an admirable job while maintaining his cover for having the interview.
 - b. SCANTLING was called on for extensive initial spade work in the BEKNAVE/BECHICK operation. SCANTLING gave his usual competent performance despite the fact that the role assigned him was unique to his experience.
 - c. SCANTLING performed one man surveillance of a sensitive Station Soviet double agent which contributed significantly to that operation.
 - d. SCANTLING was used extensively during the visit of GPIDEAL as part of the Station's effort in providing maximum protection for the GPIDEAL party.
 - e. In addition, SCANTLING performed numerous precent and neighborhood investigations, some of which were highly sensitive. SCANTLING also does most of the local investigations requested by ODACID and other ODYOKE components.
- 4. In addition to his contributions to the above objectives, SCANTLING used for miscellaneous support requirements from the Station. For example, SCANTLING handled LTEMBROIL-2 until the moturn of LIMOTOR-14 in July 152. SCANTLING is also used to spot and tent safe houses and apartments other Station operations.



- 5. As stated in the preceding Requests for Project Renewal, although SCANTLING's LEMPTY Project objectives can never be completely fulfilled, it is the Station's point that SCANTLING has made important and valuable contributions to LIEMPTY Project objectives specifically and to other Station activities in general. SCANTLING's production, measured against monetary expenditures, case officer time and other intengible factors, unquestionably justifies his continuation as an integral part of Project LIEMPTY.
- B. Raymond H. GERENDE Segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):
- 1. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical facilities through use of photographic base houses." Three photographic bases, LIMITED, LILYRIC and LICALLA, contribute to this objective. To avoid repetition, the Station is omitting the usual description of the functions of these three bases and how they contribute to the above objective. This was described in detail in the 1960 Request for Project Renewal. (HMMANIX)
- 2. "To collect operational little bration and identify operational leads pertaining to Station targets of opportunity." The LIENTRAP operation, handled by GERENDE, is still the major contributor to this objective. Among LIENTRAP's regular and extensive photographic assignments, was the photo stakeout of prominent Mexican Communists (some of whom have never been photographed previously by KUBARK) and Communist Party Headquarters. During this assignment, LIENTRAP was able to cover the recent move of PCM Headquarters (the first information Station had of the move) and to continue photo surveillance at the new site.
- 3. "To provide operational support to Station operations, i.e., rent hotel rooms and apart ments, and conduct counter-surveillances." GERENDE is used frequently to rent hotel rooms and apartments for other Station operations and activities. GERENDE's comprehensive area knowledge and personal operational carabilities combine to make him an extremely valuable Sation asset for such support activities. GERENDE also procures and services post office box detert trops for the many Station operations requirements.

4. The quality and quantity of operational information produced by the photographic bases and other entirities under GERENDE s control and supervision is considered workswhile and in some cases unique. The Station concludes, therefore, that this segment of the LIEMPTY Project should be continued.

C. Relationship to Related Mission Directive Objectives:

As stated in previous project renewals, it can readily be noted that Project LIEMPTY has provided support to many Station operations and in this manner has been a contributing factor to the furtherance of the Related Mission Directive. The project has not produced any positive intelligence nor has it been intended that it should do so. The project's sole purpose is to provide a mechanism for the development of operational information in support of other Station operations.

II. CHANGES

There have been not changes in the KIEMPTY Project during the past project year affecting either build lives or personnel.

III. EFFECTIVENESS

There has been no change in Project LIEMPTY which would alter the validity of the remarks made in Section III of 1960 project renewal request (HMMA 15979)

IV. PROBLEMS

The security problem in connection with the LICALLA operation, which was described in 1960 renewal request is still present but has caused no known difficulty. At Headquarters suggestion in HMMW-9736, the LICALLA base was reactivated on 29 May 1961. The base operator continues to be alert for any unusual incidents which might indicate that the base has been compromised.

V. PLANS

The Station considers that the project is operating at its optimum size and does not plan to expand it during the coming year. Efforts will be continued to refine and better utilize the existing project organizational arrangements. As in the past, the Station will continue its efforts to improve the compartmentation and security of the project.

VI. COSTS

A. Past Project Year Standardinance records indicate that Project LIEMPTY expended approximately \$26,250 during Fiscal Year 1962 (1 December 1961 - 30 June 1962) and has thus far during Fiscal Year 1963 (through 30 September 1962) expended about \$7,000.00. Review of Project NEAPTY

(For the Purpose of Project Renewal)

CURRENT OBJECTIVES AND PRODUCTION

A. Oliver G. SCANTLING Segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):

- 1. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical facilities." SCANTING has continued (See the last two Project Reviews forwarded as attackments to HMMA-14093, 13 November 1959, and HMMA-15979) 18 November 1960) to provide worthwhile information pertaining to this objective.
 - a. During the past vear SCANTLING has continued to be used to follow up leads produced by LIENVOY. For example, operational information recently indicated that the LIMERICK target was using the services of a Mexico City firm to repair safes. Through discreet investigation SCANTLING was able to identify the firm, its location and the name of the owner in the event that we later wished to make an approach to him or to exploit this information in another manner.
 - b. SCANTLING is still the Station's primary source for keeping current records on the residences of the many LIMERICK personnel in Mexico City. This is accomplished in several ways; the most important being SCANTLING's follow up of all LIENVOY leads which indicate the LIMERICK people are interested in renting a given piece of property. The previous project renewal request for additional details.
- 2. "To collect operational information pertaining to other targets of opportunity, foreign official installations and personnel of intelligence interest operating in Mexico." SCANTIFIC is very useful for collecting information on other Station targets.

- a. On the basis of a request to the Station from the ODACID Chief, SCANTLING was sent to Puebla to be an eyewitness to the 4 June 1961 Catholic inspired anti-CASTRO demonstrations. Not only did SCANTLING obtain the desired information, and samples of many of the leaflets used, but he prepared his report for the Station in time for the COS to give the ODACID Chief a briefing at 1000 hrs., 5 June 1961. SCANTLING does an excellent job on this type of assignment due principally to his ability to observe and report objectively.
- b. SCANTLING was instrumental in establishing that Fernando LLANES Cavero and his wife were living at a local Mexico City address. This case has been of considerable counterespionage interest to Headquarters.
- c. SCANTLING has continued his contributions to the Paul Frederick KIRSCHHOFF case by periodic interviews with the subject's neighbors and associates.
- 3. "To exploit operational leads through recruitments, debriefings, and surveillances." SCANTLING has contributed to this objective both directly and indirectly as will be noted by the examples listed below:

a. SCANTLING devoted a lot of time to	the

- d. SCANTLING spent six weeks during July and August of this year giving tradecraft and surveillance training to LIPAILS 5 and 7 from Monterrey. Although this is not a direct contribution to the above objective, it is considered sufficiently related to mention here.
- 4. In addition to his contributions to the above objectives, SCANTLING is used for miscellaneous support requirements from the Station. For example, SCANTLING is now handling LIEMBROIL-2 and will continue to do so until the return of LIMOTOR-14 in June 1962. Also, during the past project year, SCANTLING handled the LIRICE surveillance team until July 1961 when Simon D. CLACKERY (ps) returned to Mexico City. SCANTLING is also used to spot and remusafe houses and apartments for other Station operations.
- 5. As stated in the preceeding Requests for Project Renewal, although SCANTLING's LIEMPTY Project objectives can never be completely fulfilled, it is the Station's opinion that SCANTLING has made important and valuable contributions to LIEMPTY Project objectives specifically and to other Station activities in general. SCANTLING's production, measured against monetary expenditures, case officer time and other intangible factors, unquestionably justifies his continuation as an integral part of Project LIEMPTY.
- B. Raymond H. GERENDE Segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):
 - 1. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical facilities through use of photographic base houses.' Three photographic bases, LIMITED, LILYRIC and LICALLA, contribute to this objective. To avoid repetition, the Station is omitting the usual description of the functions of these three bases and how they contribute to the above objective. There has been no change in the coverage as described in the 1960 Request for Project Renewal.
 - 2. "To collect operational information and identify operational leads pertaining to Station targets of opportunity." The LIENTRAP operation, handled by CENENDE WESTERN and identify operation to this

objective. In addition to performing numerous photographic assignments in support of other Station operations. WITH TRAP devoted nearly four months, on a fulltime basis, to coverage of the LIERODE operation. For several weeks the entire "take" from the LIERODE target was recorded from the LIENTRAP vehicle. Later, the LIENTRAP agents operated the LIERODE technical gear from the initial LIERODE stationary base.

- 3. "To provide operational support to Station operations, i.e., rent hotel rooms and apartments, and conduct counter-surveillances." GERENDE is used frequently to rent hotel rooms and apartments for other Station operations and activities. GERENDE's comprehensive area knowledge and personal operational capabilities combine to make him an extremely valuable Station asset for such support activities. GERENDE also procures and services post office box letter drops for the many Station operations requiring them.
- 4. The quality and quantity of operational information produced by the photographic bases and other activities under GERENDE's control and supervision is considered worthwide. The Station concludes, therefore, that this segment of the LIEMRTY Project should be continued.
- C. Relationship to Related Mission Directive Objectives:

As stated in the previous project renewal, it can readily be noted that Project LIEMPTY has provided support to many Station operations and in this manner has been a contributing factor to the furthereance of the Related Mission Directive. The project has not produced any positive intelligence nor has it been intended that it should do so. The project's sole purpose is to provide a mechanism for the development of operational information in support of other Station operations.

II. CHANGES

There have been no changes in the ATEMPTY Project during the past project year except that SCANTLING relinquished control of the LIRICE (formerly LIJERSEY) surveillance team in July 1961 in accordance with previous plans.

III. EFFECTIVENESS

There has been no change in Project EMAMPTY which would alter the validity of the remarks hade in Secreptial by last year's project renewal request.

IV. PROBLEMS

The security problem in connection with the LICALLA operation, which was described in last year's renewal request, is still present but has not caused any known difficulty. At Headquarters suggestion in HMMW-9736, the LICALLA base was reactivated on 29 May 1961. The base operator has been cautioned to be ever alert for any unusual incidents which might indicate that the base has been compromised. This is the only problem experienced by the LIEMPTY Project during the past project year.

V. PLANS

The Station considers that the project is now operating at its optimum size and does not plan to expand it during the coming year. Rather, efforts will be devoted to refining and better utilizing the existing project organizational arrangements.

VI. COSTS

A. Past Project Year - Station finance records indicate that Project LIEMPTY expended \$21,458.00 during Fiscal Year 1961 (1 December 1960 - 30 June 1961) and has thus far during Fiscal Year 1962 (through 30 September 1961) expended about \$11,000.00. It is anticipated that about \$8,000.00 will be expended during the last two months (October and November 1961) of the project year. This will make a total expenditure during the project year of about \$40,500.00, or some \$12,500.00 under the budget estimate of \$53,000.00.

B. Ensuing Period - Of the total \$49,500.00 thidget, itemized below, \$29,500.00 should be expended during the remainder of Fiscal Year 1962 and the balance, \$20,000.00 should be expended during Fiscal Year 1963. Normal accounting procedures will be used for all expendences.

REVIEW OF PROJECT DIEMPTY (For the Purpose of Project Renewal)

CURRENT OBJECTIVES WIND PRODUCTION

A. Oliver G. SCANTLAND segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):

1. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical facilities." SCANTLING has continued (See the last Project Review forwarded as an attachment to HMMA-14093, 13 November 1959) to provide worthwhile and significant information pertaining to the above objective. There follow a few examples of SCANTLING's production:

a. A detailed casing of the LIMERICK electrical power supply was forwarded to Headquarters as an attachment to HMMA-14496, 12 Represent 1960. The production of this type of operational information, which takes several weeks to comple accurately willustrates the unusual talents has essed by SCANTLING together with his valuable contributions to the Station's operational information collection effort.

b. SCANTLING has been used frequently to follow up leads produced by LIFEAT/
LIMERICK (now produced by LIENVOY). For example, in May 1960, LIFEAT indicated that the LIMERICK target was having considerable contact with an AGENCIA ROBLES concerning the handling of incoming and outgoing shipments. By discreet investigation, SCANTLING was able to provide the Station with additional pertinent information about the address, owner and type of business engaged in by the firm. Such information then becomes readily available for exploitation should a LIMERICK shipment of reacticular interest come to the attention of the Station.

c. SCANTLING is the Station's primary investigative asset for Reeping track of current residence addressees of DIMERICK personnel. The Station considers it important from the counterespionage standpoint to maintain information on the lecation of all

LIMERICK residences. In addition, specific targets are continually considered for LICOOL installations. A recent example of SCANTLING's efforts in this connection would be the spotting and application of the LIMOTOR base in the same awardment building with LITALON -1. Contributions of this type operational information are quite time installing due to the necessity for checking out several apartments that a LIMMRICK individual may initially be considering as a residence.

- 2. "To collect operational information pertaining to other targets of opportunity, foreign official installations and personnel of intelligence interest operating in Mexico." As indicated below, SCANTLING is also extremely useful for collecting information on targets other than LIMERICK:
 - a. In March 1960 SCANFILLE was instrumental in locating property adjagent to the LITABBY installation which the Station has since rented in anticipation of initiating photographic and technical operations. SCANTLING was able to accomplish this assignment only after a thorough casing and pretext investigations of the several pieces of property appropriate for such operations.
 - b. SCANTLING is also used to follow up sensitive leads in connection with LIFEAT and LIENVOY production from LITABBY and sister targets (See example as to type under I,A,I, b and c above).
 - c. SCANTLING was used as an investigative asset to determine the local address and exact employment of Gordon William GROVES (201-220025), a counterespionage case of interest to Headquarters and ODENVY.
- 3. "To exploit operational leads through recruitments debriefings, and surveillances." As examples of SCANTLING's contribution to this objective, the following cases are listed:

a. SCANTLING devoted a considerable amount of time to his attempts to locate Cesar GONZALEZ Sanchez, a known agent of a Communist Country. He followed various leads on GONZALEZ from Manch to August 1960 before

GONZALEZ was finally identified and his Mexico City home and business addresses were ascertained. See HMMA-15626, 9 September 1960, for further details on this case.

b. The preliminary investigative work on a KUSODA case of priority interest was conducted by SCANTLING. During this investigation it was necessary for SCANTLING to travel to Aquascalientes, Guanajuato and Minatitlan to obtain the information required by Headquarters. See the attachments to HMMT-1416, 20 May 1960, for the results of the investigation.

- 4. In addition to his contributions to the above objectives, SCANTLING is used for miscellaneous support requirements of the Station. For example, SCANTLING handled several of Raymond H. GERENDE's (ps) operations while the latter was away from Mexico City during August and September 1960. Also, SCANTLING has been managing the LIJERSEY surveillance team since the departure of Simon D. CLACKETT in August 1960. It is hoped that SCANTLING can be relieved of this assignment as soon as the LITEMPO project is approved. SCANTLING has also been used to spot and rent safe houses for various Station operations, a valuable operational support service.

 5. As stated in the preceding Request for Project Renewal, although SCANTLING's LIEMPTY Project objectives can never be completely fulfilled, it is the Station's opinion that SCANTLING has made important and valuable contributions to LIEMPTY Project objectives specifically and to other Station activities in general. SCANTLING's production, measured against monetary expenditures, case officer time and other intangible factors, unquestionably justifies his continuation as an integral part of Project LIEMPTY.
- B. Raymond H. GERENDE Segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):
 - I. "To collect operational information pertaining to LIMERICK personnel and physical fabilities through use of photographic base houses." Together with their extensive photographic coverage of the LIMERICK target, the photographic bases also contribute other types of operational information:
 - a. LIMITED This base compiles daily logs indicating all arrivals, demrtures and, where possible, identities of every person visiting or working at the LIMERICK target.

O HEROTOPICAL PROPERTY.

This information is particularly useful in keeping track of LIMERICK personnel and assisting with the identification of visitors to the installation. Also, LIMITED maintains a summary attendance list of LIMERICK employees on a daily basis; this enables the Station quickly to ascertain the presence or absence of an employee on any given day. Finally, one other significant service is performed by this base, the radio dispatching of the LIEMBRACE surveillance team on LIMERICK personnel and targets of opportunity. LIMITED's photographic coverage is still concentrated on visitors, as opposed to employees, to the LIMERICK installation. A recent example of the base's contributions to Station efforts is the case of Joseph Ralph MAURI. In this case, a LIENVOY lead indicated that an American might visit the LIMERICK target on a certain day. The base was alerted to dispatch the radio-controlled surveillance team on any person appearing to be an American. The results of this assignment were indicated in MEXI-6392 and several other cables. LIMITED was also able to provide photographs, which when compared with photographs provided by Headquarters, left no question as to MAURI's identity.

- b. LILYRIC This base's output of high-quality clandestine photographs has been in about the same quantity as last year. In addition, the base operator, LIEMPTY-14, prepares weekly reports on LIMERICK employees and their wives. LILYRIC also performs the assignment of noting and reporting the license plate numbers of all cars bringing visitors to the LIMERICK installation. LILYRIC photographs also are concentrated on visitors to the target, as opposed to employees. It should be noted that LILYRIC operates for photographic coverage during the hours from daylight to 1400 hours each day of the week except Sunday. The LIMITED base maintains photographic coverage from 1400 hours to darkness each day except Sunday.
- c. LICALLA As reported in previous correspondence, the LICALLA base contributes to the collection of operational information through photographic coverage of LIMERICK employees and their families. Also, the base operator,

LIEMPTY-9, supplies extremely worthwhile information pertaining to the apparent positions and jobs of the target employees. He accomplishes this objective by careful observation and analysis. LICALLA also maintains a daily attendance roster of all LIMERICK employees. LICALLA coverage of the target, both photographic and physical observations, enables the Station to keep abrest of LIMERICK personnel changes, a vital contribution to the Station's counterespionage effort.

- 2. "To collect operational information and identify operational leads pertaining to Station targets of opportunity." The LIENTRAP operation, handled by GERENDE, is the major contributor to this objective. It has been possible for LIENTRAP to take photographs and to perform pretext investigations in support of numerous Station activities. The cases listed below are cited as examples:
 - a. In the case of Cesar GONZALEZ Sanchez (see I, A, 3, a, above) LIENTRAP was able to procure photographs of CONZALEZ at his Mexico City residence which, which compared to Headquarters provided photographs, left no doubt that GONZALEZ was the subject of interest to Headquarters.
 - b. LIENTRAP confirmed the identity of Olga CASTILLO de Ledon, a frequent visitor to the LIMERICK installation and an ardent supporter of the present Cuban regime, through a pretext investigation of the residents of an apart ment building where CASTILLO was believed to live. Later, LIENTRAP supported the results of the investigation with excellent photographs of the subject.
- 3. To provide operational support to Station operations, i.e., rent hotel rooms and apartments, and conduct counter-surveillances." GERENDE is used frequently to rent hotel rooms and apartments for other Station operations and activities. GERENDE's comprehensive area knowledge and personal operational capabilities combine to make him an extremely valuable Station asset for such support activities. GERENDE also procures post office box letter drops for the many Station operations requiring them.

- 4. It is the Station's conclusion that the money and case officer time expended on this segment of the LIEMPTY project is worthwhile and should be continued in view of the quality and quantity of operational information produced.
- C. Simon D. CLACKETT Segment (discussed in relation to project objectives):

- d. CLACKETT and the LIJERSEY coam performed numerous pretext investigations on Station targets of opportunity and on three separate occasions during the project year served as a counter-surveillance escort for Station officers in other operations.

III. EFFECTIVENESS

- A. General comments pertaining to the value of the project efforts to the Station's needs The Station is of the opinion that its operations are only as good as the support mechanisms backstopping and contributing to them. The availability of unilateral support agents and organizations, such as the LIEMPTY Project, to investigate leads and to collect operational information is an indispensable ingredient to the Station's espionage and counterespionage objectives. The Station would be seriously handicapped in its operational activities should the support services of such agents as GERENDE, SCANTLING and the agents under their control be suddenly made unavailable.
- B. LIMERICK Target The basis for most of the Station's counterespionage activities directed against the LIMERICK target require detailed knowledge of the identity, activities and fellow associates of LIMERICK personnel. The LIEMPTY photographic basehouses undoubtedly provide more of this type information than any other Station operation. The production from LIEMPTY photographic bases and from the LIENVOY project provide the Station with the large majority of LIMERICK leads.

- C. Targets of Opportunity The immediate availability of independent assets to perform investigations, photographic assignments and other essential types of support services in connection with Station targets of opportunity represent an operational advantage which this Station considers highly significant. It is due to such LIEMPTY assets that an agent can be sent to distant areas in Mexico to do investigations, that photographs can be made of individuals and places which are of operational interest and apartments and hotel rooms can be acquired in fictitious names in support of sensitive operations and activities.
- D. Although the progress and success of any support project depends upon requirements from other Station operations, it must be concluded that Project LIEMPTY has indeed been effective during the past project year.


IV. PROBLEMS

A. Security - The activities of the LICALLA base were suspended in September 1960 as a direct result of the arrest of three KURIOT technicians by the Cuban Government. One of the technicians was known to have knowledge of the four LIMUST units (LICALLA is located in one of these units) and the Station considered it appropriate to suspend photographic operations pending resolution of the situation. At this time, there is no indication when LICALLA operations will be resumed. The LICALLA base operator has reported that there have been no unusual inquiries or other suspicious actions which might indicate that LICALLA has been compromised to LIMERICK personnel; however, such a possibility will exist until the release of the three technicians. No other security problems have occurred during the past year.

V. PLANS

- A. Processing of Photographs During the past year considerable progress has been made in the Station's handling, i.e., sorting, indexing, identifying leads and filing, of photographs produced by the several bases.
- B. Photographic Techniques The previous LIEMPTY Project Renewal Request indicated that the Station planned to try new techniques using HY-PAN film in night photography. HY-PAN film was used on a trial basis during daylight hours with poor results. Almost invariably, prints

from HY-PAN negatives were too grainy and, consequently, were of little use in producing good identified shots of individuals. In view of these experiments, wight photography has not yet been attempted. It should be noted that Eastman Kodak's new TRI-X PAN film, which all bases and LIENTRAP now use, is superior to any film previously used by the Station for clandestine photography. The quality of all base photographs have been increased considerably as a direct result of this new film.

C. General Comments - The Station believes that the GERENDE segment is now operating under optimum organizational arrangments and there are no plans for expansion contemplated at this time. It is expected that SCANTLING will soon be relieved of his interim responsibility for the LIJERSEY team and can concentrate more on his investigative and casing activities. The transfer of the LIJERSEY team to Project LITEMPO reduced Project LIEMPTY activities by an appreciable amount. It is not planned, during the coming year, to expand present LIEMPTY activities.

VI. COSTS

- A. Past Project Year Station finance records indicate that Project LIEMPTY expended \$19, 120. 91 during Fiscal Year 1960 (1 December 1959 30 June 1960) and has thus far during Fiscal Year 1961 (through 31 October 1960) expended \$16, 734.69. Contract Agents salaries and allowances paid by Headquarters bring the total expenditures for 11 months of the project year to approximately \$50,000.00. An additional \$4,000.00 will be obligated during the 12th month of the project year. This will bring total project expenditures to about \$54,000.00 for the entire project year.
- B. Ensuing Period Of the total \$53,000.00 budget, itemized below, \$31,900.00 should be expended during the remainder of Fiscal Year 1961 and the balance, \$21,100.00, should be expended during Fiscal Year 1962. Normal accounting procedures will be used for all expenditures.

VII. EMERGENCY CONDITIONS

As regards the requirement listed in CSI-F No. 230-60, Annex A, for communications arrangments in the event of "Emergency Conditions." the Station does not anticipate that this project would or could continue to function under its present objectives. However, both principal agents, SCANTLING and GERENDE, would very possibly be worthwhile sources of information to maintain contact with under any adverse conditions. Both of these agents identify themselfs, in terms of ideology, motivation and perspective, more as Americans than as Mexican nationals (which they are). It is reasonable to assume, therefore, that SCANTLING and GERENDE would become valuable contacts in any emergency situation.

1. BACKGROUND.

The LIEMPTY Project is designed to collect operational information on the LIMERICK installation and personnel, as well as targets of opportunity, through stationary and mobile photographic coverage. In addition, the project provides the means for investigating leads from the above noted coverages as well as other Station sources. LIEMPTY supports other Station operations through the renting of safehouses, providing and servicing post office box letter drops, conducting counter surveillances and investigations and performing related tasks.

2. OPERATIONS - REVIEW.

The Station feels that it would be helpful to summarize at this time information previously reported to Headquarters (see paragraph 3, reference B) concerning the photo basehouses under this project and thereby give Headquarters an updated frame of reference in which to view the roles of the various basehouses.

The LIMITED and LILYRIC basehouses provide coverage of front of the LIMERICK installation. Although on the surface it may appear that these two basehouses provide duplicate take, this is not the case. It has been the Station's experience in running the unilateral LIEMRTY operation that a 0900 to evening workday, which would be required of a single basehouse in order to cover the LIMERICK target effectively, is just too long for any pair of agents to remain effective. This is especially true when it is considered that these basehouse operators are essentially unsupervised during their workday. It would also be impossible for a single basehouse to provide the kind of coverage the Station needs on the target installation, especially during the peak hours of activity, namely late morning and early afternoon

For these reasons, the LTLYRIC basehouse generally operates from 0900 to 1400 or 1500

weekdays. LIMITED operates from 1200 to 1800 or dark (as the daily situation dictates) on weekdays, and 0900 to 1400 on Saturdays. (These hours are subject to change to fit Station needs.) Special coverage for Sunday is arranged on a need basis; however, past experience has shown regular coverage of Saturday afternoons and Sundays is not rewarding. This schedule provides for both basehouses to be in action during the peak activity hours of the LIMERICK target. Although even this arrangement is not completely airtight, anything less than this would present unacceptable gaps in the coverage. It must also be considered that without two basehouses covering the front of the target installation, any illness, personal problem or vacation for operators of one basehouse would terminate Station coverage.

Also worth mention at this point is the radio "dispatching" of the LIEMERACE team by the LIMITED base. Due to the tight protective security measures instituted by the local police in the area of the LIMERICK installation it is impossible for a unilateral surveillance team to stakeout the LIMERICK installation when assigned to coverage of members of the LIMERICK staff. LIMITED operator radio dispatches the team onto target personnel giving direction, means of travel and description of dress of these targets. This permits the team to commence its surveillance a number of blocks from the LIMERICK installation and beyond the protective ring of the local police. This radio dispatching makes possible the surveillance of LIMERICK staffers which would otherwise be impossible or extremely risky. The third basehouse, LICALLA, provides coverage of the back of the LIMERICK installation and the garden area. This coverage is the real "window" the Station has into the LIMERICK target and provides a large part of the information on which Station bases its identifications of LIMERICK staffers and its estimates of staffing, personnel positions and intelligence connections of the LIMERICK personnel. Due to its position, LICALLA is also able to provide information on the LIMERICK installation which is of LAURICLE interest.

It is the Station's opinion that as long as the LIMERICK installation is a prime target of the Station, it will be necessary to maintain the present three basehouses. To eliminate any one of the three would create a gap in the Station's coverage that would not be compatible with the emphasis placed on this target by the latest RMD and the Station's responsibilities under this RMD. Is anyone against this ?

3. OPERATIONS - CURRENT.

In the past it has been stated that the LIEMPTY operation provides the majority of photographs used by the Station in its CE operations against the LIMERICK target. This is still true and will remain so for the foreseeable future. The Station, and particularly that section concerned with the LIMERICK target, has always considered the LIEMPTY photo take an essential tool in following the daily activities of the personnel of the target installation and visitors to that installation. Obviously the most interesting individuals in both these categories are those of intelligence concern. Among these have been a number of PBFRIME citizens. For those interested in statistics, LIEMPTY take for the reporting period included approximately 235 rolls of operational photos, 205 of which were directly concerned with the LIMERICK target. In addition, the daily logs kept by the basehouses on the comings and goings of the LIMERICK staff members and visitors have greatly aided the Stations CE efforts, especially in crisis times such as the CPFLOOR aff wir.

The area of specific support to the Station's Coprogram (in addition to the above) and support to other Station operations, the following is a list of selected LIEMPTY contributions in this area.

- .. LIEMPTY support to the AMROD operation continues to be essential to that operation. The contributions made by the two cutouts, Paymond H. GERENDE and Oliver C. SCANTLING, during the reporting period can be truthfully described as "making" the operation work. Only because GERENDE and SCANTLING are available to provide duly execution of the assignments levied on the Station has the Station been able to contribute fully to AMROD. 0004983
- Oliver G. SCANTLING continues in his assignment as cutout in the LIMITED phase of the LIEMPTY operation and alternate contact of LICASA-1 in a sensitive operation of LAURICLE interest. Due to the fact that SCAMMLING's wife died during the reporting period with the resulting visits of

relatives and legal details to be settled, SCANTLING's miscellaneous operational activity was somewhat curtailed. However, SCANILING did find time to take on the servicing of a post office box mail drop for the sensitive AEAMPULSE operation and complete two pretext investigations.

- c. GERENDS continued his assignments as cutout to LICALIA and LILYRIC basehouses and LIMMTRAP truck. In addition GERENDE obtained a safe apartment for use of the LIKAYAK Case Officer and performed an investigation at the Instituto Cultural Español-Mexicano at the behest of the COS. GERENDE and LIEMPTY-10 continued to provide frequent servicing of P. O. Box mail drops used operationally by Mexico City Station as well as other Stations.

 d. Special assignments were given the project basehouses concerning a matter
- of LAURICLE interest and the arrival and activities of two LIMERICK TDY officials. Full reports were prepared and supplied to the interested Station officers in these cases. The project assets have also been alerted to provide immediate reporting on a special case involving a PBPRIME citizen which is of interest to ODENVY and KUBARK. During the recent visit to Mexico of an individual of ODIBEX interest, the project assets were alerted and supplied special weekend coverage of the LIMERICK staffer who was known to have contacted the individual of interest to ODIBEX.
- During the reporting period the operational use of LIENTRAP continued to increase. This use has been primarily in the coverage of PCM and exile Communists residing in Mexico.

3. SECURITY.

LIENTRAP was involved in an accident on 24 February 1964 while returning from an operational assignment. LIENTRAP was struck on the right side by a taxi which had run a red light causing LIENTRAP to turn over on its left side. Since the operational equipment is not permanently mounted in LIENTRAP, and is carried in a small case while moving from assignment to assignment, all equipment was readily evacuated by LIENTRAP. The taxi fled the scene and LIENTRAP was able to move off under its LIENTRAP. The taxi fled the scene and LIENTRAP was able to move off under its own power. Damage to the right side and broken windshield resulted from the accident. No security problems resulted and LTENTRAP was back in operation in a week.

A survey was conducted among the agents under this project to determine if they remembered their recontact instructions and verbal recognition signals. It was learned that most had forgotten at least part of the plan. New contact plans are being formulated and current pictures of all agents have been obtained to facilitate recontact. It is planned to review the recontact instructions with the agents periodically once the new plan is worked out.

4. EQUIPMENT.

No major equipment problems other than the LTEMTRAP accident noted under "SECURITY" above were experienced during this period. In February the LUMITED camera required adjustment of the shutter and trip spring.

5. PARSONNEL.

The Station has been making a review of its personnel needs under this project in order to determine where economies could be whatituted without consing gaps in operational coverage or accrease in security of efficiency. It was been determined that LIEMPTY-12 can be ferminated under the above conditions and probably LIEMPTY-5 on well. It is plantished affect these terminations as of 1 July 1964. It also and been determined that part I July LIEMPTY-19 Will be placed on an inverty rate for work performed for the station.



It would appear from paragrapha 2a and 2b of reference that KUDESK and KUTUBE Ops have not been completely informed of the background of the LIEMPTY Project and its agent requirements. At the time HMMA-14093 (Request for Renewal of Project LIEMPTY) was written, it was assumed that the Mexico Desk and KUTUBE/D could answer any additional questions, based on reports and dispatches not normally available to the senior staffs, which might be raised during the renewal process.
- 2. In answer to paragraph 2a, Oliver G. SCANTLING first contacted Inez PARADA de Moreno in early 1957 to fulfill a KUTUBE/D requirement. He visited her as an architect interested in viewing the LIMERICK installation from the building where she lives. He was socially acquainted with her brother, .a Catholic Priest, and knew the family to be unquestionably anti-Communist. However, it would be imprudent on the Station's and SCANTLING's part to assume that PARADA does not at least suspect that some anti-LIMERICK intelligence service is involved. PARADA suggested during SCANTLING's initial visit that he could return at any time for further observations. This was reported by SCANTLING on 21 March 1957 and it does not seem appropriate to query him again on the pretext for his recent visits.
- 3. While HMMA-14093 correctly referred to LIMITED, LILYRIC and LICALLA as "photographic basehouses," the Station would like to emphasize that photographic coverage is only one of their functions (please see HMMA-12095, 4 February 1959). LIMITED is used as a radio dispatch base for automobile surveillance teams in addition to physical surveillance of persons entering the front gate. Their photography is negligible compared to their other duties. The LILYRIC base performs the best photography of persons visiting the front gate, perhaps because the vantage point for taking the pictures is from the second floor and above the street traffic which partially blocks LIMITED photographs. LILYRIC also does individual reports on LIMERICK personnel entering and leaving the main gate. LICALLA is used almost exclusively to identify LIMERICK officials and to support KUTUBE/D requirements in connection with the LIMESA/LIMUST Project. As an indication of the effectiveness of LICALLA photographic coverage, the Mexico Station has all the LIMERICK officials identified. Before this base was activated more than twothirds of the LIMERICK officials were unidentified. In order to support other operations, it is considered essential that the Station identify all LIMERICK officials. In this respect, LieALLA has provided most of the necessary information. The retention of this base is also considered vital to the security of the LIMUST portion of the LIMESA Broject.
- 4. The Station does not agree that the color photography and moving pictures are a luxury. Color slides were made for identification purposes and have proved useful, particularly in identifying facial features and skin coloring. The motion pictures were made at Headquarters suggestion (Please see HMMW-7687, 29 May 1959 and HMMW-8438, 26 January 1960).

In conclusion, the Station would like to point out that the "photographic basehouses" represent an integral and significant part of the Station's counterespionage effort against the LIMERICK installation. These bases do not produce Foreign Intelligence and should not be considered in such a light.
