## MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD

SUBJECT: Everette Howard Hunt, Jr.

- 1. On 30 June 1972, Mr. Arnold L. Parham, Federal
  Bureau of Investigation, inquired of the Acting Deputy Director of
  Security (PS), Mr. Leo Dunn, as to documents issued by the Agency
  to Everette Howard Hunt, Jr., in the alias Edward Joseph Hamilton
  or any other alias. He mentioned specifically, a Drivers
  License; Massachusetts Auto Registration Form; Card,
  and Insurance Policy.
- 2. I telephoned Ed Duffy, TSD Security Officer, but he wasn't in. I ended up talking with Wesley M. Parcells, x2531, who checked TSD files on documentation issued in the alias "Hamilton." This is the only way the name is now listed on TSD's records. They have no first name or middle initial. Their records simply reflect that on two occasions sometime between 1957 and 1964, alias documentation was issued to someone in the name of "Hamilton." The requests are numbered 1005 and 2134 on the TSD Control Card. They do not cross-reference alias names to true names, and could not say whether or not Subject was issued any other alias.

Providence, Rhod	le Island, address.	Mr. Parcells said it is possible	
that this was issu	ed, and also possib	le that he would have been issued	
a	Card and insurance	policy. None of these would have	
been backstopped.	. Mr. Parcells said	d it would have been difficult or	
impossible to ren	ew the	Drivers License because one	
would have to sho	w up for a test. (It	has been the writer's experience	
that this was not :	necessarily true in ;	past years.) The 10	
Drivers License	would have expired	in two years. The	
Card, while fake,	would be "valid" ir	idefinitely. The insurance policy	
would presumably	expire at whatever	date it bore.	

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4. I telephoned Mr. Lawrence Sternfield, Chief, WH/COG, asking him for information in WH Division files as to what documentation Subject might ever have been issued. Mr. Sternfield said that WH Division files would not reflect information relating to any of Subject's aliases.

	5. I next spoke to Mr. Willard Burke, Central Cover Staff
	x5122, who advised that a Drivers License and a
0	Auto Registration Form are two different items. He
	checked his records on Subject, and found, after pulling them from
	Retired Files, that there was nothing relative to Cover documentation
	there. I then checked the file myself, just to be sure. He is correct;
. ,	there is nothing usable in the file as regards Cover documents or cover
	documentation of any kind, with the exception of references to Subject #
	State Department status on various overseas tours and trips.
