WETA REPORT (INTERNAL SECURITY)
(ALSO WETA REPORT, WETA 7/1/50)

1. Subject was born in Vienna, Austria, on 5 January 1916, as Evelyn HUBER, the daughter of Julius and Rosa (nee HUBER) HUBER. She attended grammar school, high school, and secondary school in Vienna, and in 1934, went to Berlin where she worked for a year teaching with a church group.

2. The couple crossed over in the following year with the money, and on returning to Vienna, met Gustav HUBER, whom she married in 1938. The couple went to Berlin where HUBER was editor of a Communist paper. Subject played on the German stage for about 2 years. After three years of married life (during which time she had become a Communist and had been active in Communist Party work) she and HUBER separated.

3. Shortly thereafter, she fell in love with Dr. Julius ROBERT, an American citizen, who spent much time in Germany. A Communist, ROBERT was co-editor of a book publishing concern, "Wolff Verlag," a known Party left-wing publishing firm, under the influence of the Communist Party. In 1946 subject divorced HUBER and married ROBERT for whom she had been working several years prior to their marriage.

4. Subject and ROBERT went to Paris after their marriage and then to the U.S., arriving at the U.S. Institute. After a brief stay in New York, they went to San Francisco and lived with ROBERT's mother. In 1949 they returned to Greenwich Village, New York, where they associated with many Communists. In January 1950 the couple returned to Berlin, to West Berlin/Paris, where ROBERT worked for the Institute of Social Research.
