SUBJECT: Approval of Recommendation for the Intelligence Medal of Merit to David A. PHILLIPS

1. On 8 September 1956, General Cabell, Acting Director of Central Intelligence, approved the recommendation that Mr. Phillips be awarded the Intelligence Medal of Merit. A copy of the "Report of Honor Awards Board," Form No. 37-176, indicating this approval is attached for your retention.

2. The Deputy Director of Central Intelligence has indicated that, generally speaking, he would like to make the presentation promptly in the Director's Conference Room. Our records indicate that Mr. Phillips is not at headquarters and in view of this, it would be appreciated if you would notify me when he will be available. Upon receipt of your suggestions, I will make recommendations to General Cabell for his approval.
