APPRAISAL OF CONTENT: ADZHUBEY PROBABLY MADE THE COMMENTS AS REPORTED.

DURING A RECEPTION AT THE SOVIET EMBASSY, ALEKSEY ADZHUBEY CRITICIZED HIS GOVERNMENT'S ERROR IN OVEREMPHASIZING INDUSTRY AT THE EXPENSE OF AGRICULTURE. HE URGED THE SOVIET DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY TO INCREASE ITS CONTACT WITH THE THAI PEOPLE IN ORDER TO IMPROVE REPORTING ON LOCAL CONDITIONS. ADZHUBEY FELT THE THAIS SHOULD KNOW THE SOVIETS BETTER TOO. ADZHUBEY SAID SEATO, CENTO AND NATO ARE USELESS, THAT THERE IS TROUBLE IN VIETNAM AS WELL AS LAOS, AND THAT THAILAND SHOULD LEAVE THE CHINA PROBLEM TO THE USSR. LATER COMMENTS BY ADZHUBEY TO PRIME MINISTER THANOM AND DEPUTY MINISTER THANAT ON POOR PRESS COVERAGE OF SOVIET EVENTS ARE MENTIONED IN CS - 1567,770.

AFTER A RECEPTION GIVEN IN HIS HONOR AT THE SOVIET EMBASSY, BANGKOK, ON 24 NOVEMBER 1963, ALEKSEY ADZHUBEY, IZVESTIYA EDITOR AND KHRUSHCHEV'S SON-IN-LAW, DELIVERED A SPEECH TO SOVIET BLOC REPRESENTATIVES WHO HAD BEEN INVITED TO STAY AFTER THE RECEPTION. ADZHUBEY EXPRESSED DEEP PERSONAL AND NATIONAL REGRET AT THE DEATH OF PRESIDENT KENNEDY AND EULOGIZED HIS EFFORTS TO LESSEN WORLD TENSION. CONCERNING THE SOVIET UNION, ADZHUBEY EXPLAINED THAT THE GOVERNMENT HAD ERRED IN PLACING TOO GREAT AN EMPHASIS ON INDUSTRIAL DEVELOPMENT WITH TOO LITTLE THOUGHT OR EFFORT FOR THE AGRICULTURAL NEEDS OF THE POPULATION. THIS LED TO THE SHORTAGE OF WHEAT IN PARTICULAR AND FOOD IN GENERAL. ADZHUBEY EMPHASIZED THAT MEMBERS OF THE SOVIET DIPLOMATIC COMMUNITY IN THAILAND SHOULD MAKE GREATER EFFORTS TO CONTACT THAI OFFICIALS TO LEARN MORE ABOUT THAILAND AND ITS PEOPLE. THIS WOULD PERMIT BETTER AND MORE COMPREHENSIVE REPORTING ON LOCAL CONDITIONS. ON OTHER MATTERS, HE STATED, THAT SOME CONTACTS MAY NOT AGREE WITH THE SOVIET POLITICAL PHILOSOPHY - THERE ARE MANY OTHER AREAS ON WHICH CONTACT IS WANTED. THE SOVIETS SHOULD LEARN MORE ABOUT THAILAND, BUT IT IS MORE IMPORTANT FOR THE THAI TO KNOW THE SOVIETS BETTER.
