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- 6. The report also contains estimates of the strength of resistance groups inside Cuba, the loyalty of the Cuban armed forces to Pidel Castro, and general comments on the composition of the revolutionary groups which form the PRD.
- 7. It is not known at this time what plans if any the Spanish government may have for continued liaison with Cuban resistance groups, or whether they anticipate lending more concrete support other than the moral support already implied by their consenting to send this initial mission. [QUANTUM/30] has indicated that there is no present plan for personnel support.
- It is requested that this dispatch and its attachment be brought to the attention of the Cuban and Spanish desk reports sections in order that any new positive intelligence it contains may be disseminated, Station is not in a position to determine. We judge that its principal interest lies in the fact that the Spanish government has established lieison with the resistance groups and its possible knowledgeability, as a result, of ODYOKE covert plans and operations in the Cuban area.
