1. Peramse CASAS did not call before 1:30 hours. PEARY called him at his firm in accordance with arrangements made last night. CASAS said 05 that his chief would not release him for the several days required for the Kexico trip. On being asked if he objected to our discussing the situation with his chief, CASAS said that he had no objections, but he 05 did express concern about his job. He was assured that his job was not to be jeopardized. On further query, [CASAS] said that he would make the 05 trip if we could get the approval of his chief.

2. In the meantime, SAS/Security came up with information on CASAS 05 firm, and especially on his chief, [HALLCCK], and by mid aftermoon, rot a clearance permitting us to discuss our utilization of [CASAS] with [HALLOCK].

をあらりの 3. Before batting up to Harrisburg to talk to HALLOCK, we telephoned him at his office to inquire as to his availability. He was, however, already well aware of our concern, having discussed the matter with CASAS 05 at noon (apparently just after we called CASAS and mentioned that we would 0% contact his chief). Although we pointed out clearly that CASAS was required 05 to provide vital assistance in an effort of considerable value to the U.S. (S) Government, KALLOCK replied that his firm also had a priority requirement of importance involving the Government of Costa Rica: in connection with this job. Cossa Rica had sent an engineer to deal with the firm; this engineer would be in Harrisburg until the end of the month. CASAS absence would by result in inactivity on the part of this engineer, and every day lost would be contrary to the requirements of the contract between the firm and the Covernment of Costa Rica. (HALLOCK) added that CASAS had told him (SP) of that he did not want to leave his canignment. (Although HALLOCK was probably wood refusing CASAS bervices through self - his firm's - interest, I feel that OF CASAS definitely asked HALLOCK to put up as strong a resistance to his
