Miami, May 8,1961.

A situation of unrest and dissatisfaction which appeared within the MDC before the invasion has apparently come to a head.

It originated when four members of the six Executives of the F.R.D. united under the Generational T esis. This provoked a crisis within the FRD and all of it's components organizations.

It appeared at the time that Rasco would be substituted by the Executive Committee within Cuba. The Miami Committee of the MDC backed Rasco. This situation was solved at the time by a trip here to Miami, taken by Lucas, the Goordinator of the MDC in Cuba, and at the same time, General Coordinator of the FRD.

In a personal conversation with Lucas, he informed me that they were not satisfied with Rasco, but that he agreed that it was not the time for a substitution within the MDC with detriment to this organization, the FRD and the general Revolutionary effort. At this time Lucas mentioned Fermin Peinado and Melchor Gaston as possible substitutes.

The non inclusion of an MDC member in the Revolutionary Council, produced a further discontent within this organization, not withstanding the inference of MTró Cardona of amplifying the Council within Cuba, which implied that Lucas, the MDC Coordinator, would be a member of the Council.

In the last few days several maneuvers have taken place within the MDC and although at first it appeared that Melcher Gasten would substitute Rasso, now seems that Fermin Peinado has the majority of the votes, within the Executive of the MDC. An Executive meeting of the MDC is scheduled for today at five and a General Assembly to-nite at 8 o'clock and a decision should be produced in the General Assembly.

In should be noted that this is being done in the Mami Executive that had previously backed Rasco, with the apparent consent of the Movement within Cuba.

The Jesuit Society, which originally created the MDC in Cuba, has not interfered in this development, but apparently prefers Melchor Gaston to Fermin Peinado.

Rasco has been critized within his organization for appearing in the newspapers with a "beard".
