SENIOT: Citizenship Status of Bernard Leon Barker, Jr., 201-20169

- Lo On & August, Mr. Hemard Hunt and Mr. Conferred with Mr. Marmer and Mr. O'Heall of the Conerel Counsel's office on the subject of restoration of the citizenship of Bernard Barker. For further information see a necorandom, dated 14 July 1957, which summarizes the previous steps taken to rectore this citizenship and a negorandom, dated 17 July 1%1, giving Mr. Barker's statement to the Office of Security in regard to his case. These semerands are in the subject's 201 file. Mr. Marmer recommended that Mr. Toccay see Mr. Murphy of the Alien Affairs Office to get the complete background on the situation before any further efforts are made to obtain restoration of subject's citizenship. Any information obtained should be passed to Mr. O'Meill of the Office of the General Commel in Room 221, Mart Building.
- 2. Br. conferred with Fr. Massett of the Alien Affairs Office on the Barnard Barker case. Fr. Massett was familiar with the case and produced the susmary of the Landgration and Katuralization file on Barker, dated Lt. July 1959. This susmary mentions ten linuse Barolutions, Su. 7656 and No. 5349, which were introduced on subject a stismostup in 1954 and 1955 but which were not passed.
- Jo Mr. Ensett is making a current check with the Office of Ensignation and Haturalization to determine what happened to the aftermentioned kills and to accertain any current information concerning the subject's case. According to Mr. Massett, there will probably be the alternatives from which to choose. The first is that the Office of the Ocneral Councel, through congressional liminon, could have a new bill presented to Congress to restore the citizenship of Mr. Marker. The other way would be that Mr. Barker could have the country, for example, go to Marico, apply for an immigration visa, and presentally obtain permitted resident alies status and be mighle for citizenship in flue years.
