SIBJECT: Barold CIRIXELL

- 1. This Agency is in receipt of information dated 7 July someorning one Harold CITELNILL, born March 10, 1923, New York, New York, New York, U.S. passport number 743701, including wife Beulah, daughter Marilya, issued Jammery 20, 1958, washington, D.C. Subject exrived in Copenhagen with his family June 29 from Moscow claiming involuntary detention in the USA from October 25, 1958. Subject entered the USA via Csechoalovakia on February 27, 1958 as a tourist but with the intention of establishing residence and adopting Soviet citizenship. Subject claimed he was given employment as a Design Engineer in a Pharkov factory which manufactured sine safety equipment, but by the fall of 1958 he had become disillusioned with the Soviet system and began efforts to return to the United States.
- 2. In an interview with an efficer of the U.S. Ambassy in Copenhagen, Subject intimated that the USER has attempted and may continue to attempt to use his family or their activities to the detrinent of the United States. His wife claimed to be strongly anti-Soviet and stated that she accompanied her husband only to preserve the family unity. Since subject was highly nervous and someorned only with his immediate return to the United States, it was impossible to obtain a complete or coherent story. Subject privately arranged for his passage to the United States. He and his family were due to arrive in new York via LAS flight SK 911, July 3, 6:55 A.M. His probable destination in the United States was given as: Hrs. Swa CITRYNELL, (mother), 2741 Halace Avenue, Bronx, New York; or Abraham MARCUS (wife's father), 304 E. Flace, Bronx.
- 3. The address of 2741 Values avenue bears a telephone listing under the name of Jacob CITRINGL, Kingsbridge 7-1517. The address 304 E Place is probably 314 scho Place which bears a telephone listing under the name of A. MARCUS, CIpress 4-1231.
- 4. The records of this office reflect that one Abraham MARKUS, born 22 February 1887 in Serejas, Lithmania, spelied for a U.J. visa at the American Embassy in rexice City during the reath of
