SOURCE **A Bulletin (C) in contact with the Polish Commercial Delegation in Warsaw-Princes, who saw the draft, Appendix. It is probable that the draft was written as reported.**

A draft of a letter to Joseph Edward Charles, Director General of the Bulletin Bank of Commerce was seen in the office of Wladyslaw Galdzi, Polish Commercial Representative in Warsaw-Princes in mid-January 1965. The draft indicated that George De Herencshildt had agreed to the sale of 60 tons of grade 2 and 7 steel, the former at 9.4 U.S. cents per pound FOB, the latter at a slightly different price. The draft referred to some sales conditions already agreed upon and stated that if there were no review of objections to the sale terms within three days, it would be assumed that the conditions of sale were acceptable.

Field Comment. Mr. George De Herencshildt is an American geologist who is assigned to the Bulletin government to make a geological survey of Baltic. According to De Herencshildt's contract with the Bulletin government dated 13 May 1963, De Herencshildt was to be paid \$30,000 each and the balance of \$665,360 in steel at the rate of 35 cents per month. The value of the steel was to be determined by the market price less 5%. De Herencshildt is also associated with General Joseph Charles in a company to explore steel production in the Baltic area, Baltic area.
