**Identification of Photographs of Soviet Officials Assigned to the U.K. as of April 1961.**

On 28 December 1961, AKLADLE was shown a collection of photographs of Soviet officials assigned in the United Kingdom. The collection contained photographs identified only by a number keyed to a list of identities which was not shown to him. From the collection of over 250 photographs, AKLADLE recognized and commented on nine individuals. His remarks, listed in attachment, may be passed to **[BNOTH]** and **[JAGUAR]**. a) Photo #28 - Name unknown, but he is in intelligence

b) Photo #40 - Face is familiar. He may be in intelligence.

c) Photo #98 - Face is familiar. Probably in intelligence.

d) Photo #119 - Face is familiar. Reminds Source of one Lev LEBEDEV a fellow student at the age of about 15. Source would like to know the identity of Photo #119.

Lev Alekseyevich BRAGIN

Born 8 September 1925. Assigned to the Soviet Mission to the UN in New York between December 1954 and August 1958. Photo identified by both DERYABIN and RASTVOROV as connected with intelligence. Identified while in the U.S. by the FBI as a known intelligence officer, probably GRU. He was not declared PNG by the U.S. Government, but in May 1959 an official note was sent to the UN Secretary General stating that the U.S. Government did not want him in the U.S. again. Assigned to the Soviet Embassy in London as a 2nd Secretary in April 1961.

Nikolay Danilovich DUNKOV

Born 29 October 1920. Door-keeper at the Soviet Embassy in London between 1954 and 1957. Identified by DERYABIN as an officer in the Foreign Intelligence Directorate connected with either the Technical or Code Section some time in 1952 or 1953. Assigned to the Soviet Embassy in London as a clerk in July 1960.

Grigoriy Petrovich KONKOV

Born 20 February 1918. Traveled only once as a "diplomatic courier" in the spring of 1956 to Canada, Mexico and the U.S. Recorded as "probably KGB" and not a genuine courier. Assigned to the Soviet Embassy in London as a clerk in May 1960.

Lev Yakovlevich LEBEDEV

Born 28 October 1928. Assigned to the Soviet Trade Delegation in London as an engineer in January 1961. No other information.

e) Photo #130 - Face is familiar.  
(No other comment).

Yriy Ivanovich LOGINOV.  
Born 18 November 1924. An English interpreter assigned to the Allied Control Commission in Vienna between 1950 and 1954. Acted as interpreter at the 1955 Summit Conference and the 1957 Suez Canal Conference. Recorded as a suspect intelligence officer, probably KGB. Assigned to the Soviet Embassy in London as a 2nd Secretary in June 1957.

f) Photo #138 - Probably in intelligence.

Vladimir Augustovich MEDNIS,  
Born 22 January 1931. Assigned to the Soviet Consulate in London as a clerk in July 1959. No other information.

g) Photo #149 - Probably in intelligence.

Yevgeniy Mikhailovich MURASHEV.  
Born 18 August 1925. Assigned as a 3rd Secretary on TDY at the Soviet Embassy in London in the summer of 1956 who returned in the fall on PCS. Handles cultural affairs. Recorded as "suspect KGB."

h) Photo #221 - In intelligence, probably GRU.

Konstantin Nikolayevich SUKHORUCHKIN. Born 23 August 1915. Commodore. Naval Attache in the Netherlands from December 1954 to early 1958. Recorded as "known GRU." Assigned as the Naval Attache in London in December 1959.

i) Photo #224 - A code clerk. Source had a meeting with him in Moscow or in Austria about 10 or 12 years ago.

Dmitriy Semenovich BULTANOV.  
Born 11 August 1918. Assigned to the Soviet Embassy in London as a cipher clerk in April 1959. No other information.
