- 1. Who Helms sivised Mr. Rochs that he would like to divide the conversations into two parts. The first part which he wanted to discuss in the morning was the subject of the DRZ reports on the storage of missiles in caves and subterranean sites in Cuba. In the afternoon Mr. Being stated he would like to discuss the DRX/CIA & relationship.

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obvious difficulty would appear to be that the missiles could be counted twice, and as several people were reporting on the missiles, each could have reported a missile of a different sixe, Rocha agreed this was a problem but stated they had asked their sources to estimate the length of the missiles they reported, and that these estimates vary between 30 and 40 feet. Rocha believes their sources are reporting valid information as they are the same sources who reported what he considers accurate information on missiles 1-2 months again Rocha then quoted from the 12 October 1952 issue of "The Cuban Report", a newsletter published by the DRE.

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"Dufing the months of June, July and August, more than eighty seven Soviet ships docked at Cuban ports carrying men and war material, that included ground-to-air rockets, and guided missiles with a range of over 1,000 miles."

Rochs added that as the information was correct in the past, he believed the information was correct at the present time. Rocha explained that the reports were honest, were not inflated, and are not being used for propaganda purposes.

3. In order to take advantage of Rocha's presence in Washington, Mr. Helms suggested that Rocha take the rest



of the morning with two specialists and pinpoint on a map
the underground missile sites which they have been reporting.
Rochs answered he would be glad to do this, but that he was
not the best man for the job as it was Angel Losano, who is
presently in Missi, who had previously worked on these reports and pinpointed the locations with his Agency contacts
in Missi.

Albert Davies and Mr. William Tidwell to meet and discuss the subject mater with Mr. Rocha and Mr. Laea. During this meeting in Mr. Helms' conference room, Rocha plotted the locations on a map of Cuba and gave Colonel Davies copies of the information which he had carried with him. Colonel Davies stated he would check the information and would forward any further questions about this information to Mimi to be discussed with them there. Mr. Rocha again apologized for not being able to provide more details but again stated that Mr. Losano in Mimi was such more familiar with the details of these reports.
