1. Reference requested 1,000-3,000 copies of the book version of "The Pursues of a University," for distribution in Argentina by the [redacted] since no copies had as yet reached Headquarters, KINRG. [redacted] of the information which had given some financial support to the publisher to learn if it had in fact appeared. According to their most recent information from OSOET, the sponsor of both the pamphlet and the book, the longer version should be out any day. Although no price was given OSOET did advise the foundation that the initial press run was to be 3,000, 1,000 of which were to be mailed direct to:

- A) Participants in the last EABF
- B) Disgraced universities in Latin America
- C) Ministers of Education and External Affairs
- D) National and local student unions in Latin America
- E) National youth committees
- F) Youth sections of political parties
- G) International youth organizations
- H) Student newspapers
- I) Selected foreign (non-Latin American) addresses

The remaining 2,000 copies will be distributed through the publisher's regular channels. In view of the size of the request, in comparison

29 with the size of the press run, and for the sake of operational simplicity and security, we would suggest that the [redacted] place their order with the publishing house directly (Editorial del Pacifico, Santiago) or get in touch with either ODEPU or the IRI, both of whom would undoubtedly welcome the [redacted] assistance in giving the document wider distribution. ODEPU's address is P. O. Box 13-D Santiago de Chile, and the IRI's (Instituto Revolucionario Estudiantil) is P. O. Box 16, Miami, Florida.

29 2. We assume the [redacted] are on ODEPU's mailing list, but will forward a copy of the book to Buenos Aires for review as soon as copies are available at Headquarters. It may be that the booklet, which appeared in Spanish and French as well as English, will prove to be more suitable for the purpose indicated than the longer version. Here again, however, we have no cost figures. So far as we know, the booklet has not been put on sale but was distributed by the IRI and ODEPU. Additional copies could be obtained from either organization, providing their supplies are not already exhausted, or perhaps a second press run of the booklet could be arranged if the [redacted] were to request as many as 3,000 copies.

3. Alternatively, Headquarters could have the booklet reproduced by photo offset. This process would not duplicate the booklet so well that the copy would be indistinguishable from the original—color, binding and paper would be different—but it might serve the Station's purposes more cheaply and quickly. We will await the results of the [redacted] inquiries before placing an order unless advised to the contrary.

29 4. If JMWAVE has or could obtain further information on the booklet, Headquarters would be interested in learning what distribution it has received in Latin America, as well as how many copies in what languages are still available. Since IRI/OP has contributed to the publication and mailing costs, though not the total amount required, it would also be helpful to know how much, if any, support JMWAVE may have given through their contacts and, secondly, how much you might be able to invest in securing wider distribution of the booklet, if more distributors like the [redacted] were to present themselves.
