AMERICAS REPORT

SUMMARY

Despite reports and accusations to the contrary (WASH 3779), the Student Revolutionary Directorate is responding to USIAK guidance and control with increasing feasibility. Their withdrawal from the ARD's command (LTC 8006) and subsequent condemnation of prisoner return (LTC 1704) has been a morale boost for their clandestine organization within PRIMERA as well as due to their recruitment of USIAK qualified support; namely, closer scrutiny of funding, limited and professional infiltration of their agents, and denial of support for their independent maritime efforts. While some 16 of their fully trained USIAK infiltration agents are still patrolling the coast and boating, the DRE Executive Committee has turned to the ARD's project for more imaginative and effective operations.

1. CASE PROJECT

1. Agent and Personnel:
 - a. Total number of candidates processed to date: 75
 - b. Total number assigned: 40 (See attached Status List)
 - c. Total assigned during April 1962: 3
 - d. Total Financial Exports: Subsidies: \$12,169.00
Operations: 1,313.00

2. Operations:

- a. By 9 April 1962, the radio network by ARD/RSI directed against the United States had been transmitted to 11 countries and resulted in over 100 programs per month. (SAC 3733)
- b. Since 19 April, ARD/RSI enlarged to 15 countries over casts about 65,000 leaflets with a 55-minute and address list for coastal areas smuggling operation. (SAC 3811)
- c. Excerpts from Unidad Popular and reports from ARD/RSI claim and Quemado II have indicated that each of the public internet and agitation for Unidad Popular to diplomatic relations with PRIMERA was generated by ARD/RSI agent/operatives which began with the dissemination of 10,000 leaflets to the presidential palace in January. (SAC 1611)

4. On 21 April 1972, AGS-53 and 63 reported single chart of a series well known at the Montevideo Airport in Montevideo. There was no cover or the Montevideo station personnel had WAVE in checking on this currently.
5. Acting on Headquarters protocol (CIR 04025) to send a student agt/prop through right countries intelligence in preparation for forthcoming student congresses, an AGS-53 (one of four) is preparing materials, documentation, itinerary, action plan and contacts for this tour. (WAVE 2014, WAVE 3059) 02
6. During April, in Venezuela, [redacted] (an AGMRA station by station) and AGMRA-53 (requested by station) conducted training and organization of "Action Democratic youth in Guerrilla warfare and anti-communist tactics." This activity is supervised under station direction.
7. In Ecuador, the "Action Anti-Communist Conference" organized by AGMRA-53 and 63 is now expected to total about 5,000 persons with delegations in most major cities in Ecuador. Participation into this historic event has reached the stage that DSE and WAVE prop is being translated and printed in the "Unidad Popular" daily.
8. In Uruguay, the "Revolutionary Co-Revolutionary Moral University" is organized by AGMRA-53, to conduct its own generated bld faculties of the University in their struggle against the Communist dominated PCUS (Federacion Estudiantil Universitaria Uruguay).

3. Plans and Principles:

- a. Financial support to the AGMRA project must be accelerated for operations. There is an evident lack of proportion between salaries and operational funds, especially in view of their potential as recognized by HQ, Task Force W and DDCI/CIA.
- b. AGMRA as a station has not recognized the gravity of enlargement of its efforts for AGMRA development alone. All station activities at present are dedicated to this procedure and the operational potential is neglected.
- c. When WAVE is properly staffed and AGMRA are full strength, the following potential exists:

1. Third country operations against the denied areas for intelligence gathering, agt/prop, and generation of international revolution to the AGS.

2. Potential student and youth organizations with covert and covers activities designed to nominate the correct communist participation in schools and universities of all Latin America.

b-2 continuing program of infiltration of AMILIT members in both countries by a student of a private school that has actually suffered Communist takeover.

S-block operations against the border area and within the host country.

II. ACTIVITIES

1. Support and Processing:

- a. Financial support for AMILIT operations in PRIMEX for April consisted of \$7,000.00 sent in through the black market exchange. \$25,000.00 pesos have been vouchered and are awaiting infiltration of AMILIT scheduled for 10 May 1962. During April \$725.00 was sent in \$25.00 agency orders for funding facilities of AMILIT members in their departure.
- b. AMILIT courier a message to Miami requesting a list of electronic supplies for the small radio sets and preparation of electronic detonating devices. AMILIT is working on procurement of these items which are to be sent in partly in diplomatic pouch and partly in low infiltration operations.
- c. WAZ has processed AMILIT-52 as their cadre who is expected to begin training by the end of April. Subject is in the process of evaluation and LCFLUTTER.

2. Operations:

- a. AMILIT clandestine teams spent the first week in April placing black B-2 signs in Kirov, Yagalo, Mariano, to walls and cars.
- b. Also during the first week, a bomb was exploded in a language college setting fire to the auditorium.
- c. During early April a bomb was exploded in front of the Mariano Mercadal government office.
- d. A report from their Action team in Kovesa Province indicates their last cache of 400 lbs of C-4 plastic is almost exhausted.
- e. During the entire month of April, AMILIT clandestines have worked along the north coast of Malacca collecting operational intelligence for forthcoming supply operations. This information should be available sometime during May and June.
- f. During the third week in April, eight/draw teams posted 522 seals on automobiles throughout the general greater Kovesa area.
- g. During the first two weeks, more than 10,000 copies of "T-1000", the official B-2 organ, were printed and distribution is now in, detainees, Pinar del Rio and officials.

- A. SOVIET prop teams are printing R&E "books" (handing certificates) in small quantities for internal support.
- I. A carrier message requisitioning electronic banalies for small radio plants and electronic detonators is currently being studied for procurement by KGB and will be shipped in by diplomatic pouches and infiltration when procured.
- J. ARMY action teams in Northern Rhodes are burying came and hexogen fields using small candles as time delay igniters.

A. Training:

- a. ARMY-53 entered clandestine tradecraft training in preparation for his PRAGUE infiltration scheduled for about 10 May 1962.
- b. 14 Trained ARMY-53 members infiltrating in Miami have been processing weapons locally and going out into the overflight area for small arms practice, and holding classes on general theory, review of their training on sabotage, demolition and guerrilla warfare.
- c. ARMY maritime section has a secret base at Miller's dock in Marathon where they have their SOVET II berthed. They have crew quarters and have fully equipped the vessel with the exception of food at their own expense. On 23 April, a chartered run was made from base to Libon Key toward Veradero and Cienfuegos areas and return to base. All assignments operated well and Miller had 21, 43, and 47 were on as crew. If USSR support for their operations is not approved it can be expected that they will make every effort to operate independently and without the vital coordination for such operations.
