He gave LANCE a small Russian art book with an inscription and his signature. COLUB put on some records and once asked LANCE to dance. A little while after dinner a knock was heard at the front door. In walked another Soviet carrying some reels of film and a movie projector. GOLUB introduced this young man to the girls but (AE) 5 did not catch his name and did not want to make an abvious attempt to mind out what his name was. A screen and the projector were set up in a room in which there was no furniture. Then GOLUB asked the two girls and his wife to come in as he wanted to show some films. Both (E) and (AE) overe delighted because they felt they were going to see some films on the Soviet Union. However, the only films that GOLUB had were some Walt Disney cartoons Starring Mickey Mouse and Donald Duck. During the showing GOLUB laughed uproariously and seemed to enjoy the films tremendously. After the films they went back into the living room and chatted some more. About 2500 hours both the girls felt they had stayed long enough and said they would have to be going. GOLUB stated that he and his wife would walk them home. As they left the apartment Mrs. COLUB walked arm-in-arm with AEVS, and GOLUB walked arm-in-arm with AEVS. GOLUB called AE/5 once or twice after the finner to invite her out again, but (AF)5 had always previous engagements. On 16 June GOLUB phoned (AE/5 and asked if she could join him and his wife for a movie on Saturday night, 20 June (CAE/5 said no, that she had plans for the weekend. wasn't there but felt she had to go along to the movie. They went to the Capitol Theater in Halsinki which usually shows Soviet films. GOLUB went to the cashier, spoke Ensaian, and ordered two tickets. When they walked into the theater (AE) 5, note: that there were very few people in the theater. COLUB had bought the most expensive seats, loges, which are individual compartments usually for two people. CALVS was somewhat nervous and uneasy, however, COLUB was a perfect gentleman throughout the whole performance. After the movie COLUB walked EXAS, to her bus. They walked around the town for about an hour while the two of them discussed Soviet political theory, and Soviet vs western culture. GOLUB stated Soviet Russia had to intercede, that the bulk of the people in Hungary want a communist government, and only a few reactionaries started the revolution. He stated that that was the reeson they had to send Soviet tanks. He then brought up the example of the US action in Guatamala. When this took place, he stated the Soviets protested and protested, but everyone knew in the Soviet Union that this action was something the US had to do to protect its own interests. He said this was the same situation in Hungary.

- 5. (AE)5 stated that even though the discussion/argument was quite long and intense it never became heated nor did GOLUB become angry. He kept repeating Otto (AE)5 that she should return to the Soviet Union for another tourist trip. OZAE)5 stated that she would like to very much and would think about it. GOLUB also told her that it would be good for her to study a year at the University of Moseow but that this would probably not be good for (AE)5's future to have something like this on her record.
- 6. On 25 June GOLUB phoned (AR)'S again to inform her that he had just received some more phonograph records from the Soviet Union and she might like to hear them. On 28 June he phoned her again merely to chat. At this time he told her that his wife was leaving for holidays in Moscov and that there was some man in Moscov she loved better than her husband. This surprised (AR)'S o≥ who told GOLUB he shouldn't joke like that. GOLUB assured her that he was not joking.
