1. At the same meeting at which we discussed the [REDACTED] case with [REDACTED], a number of miscellaneous items came up, which we will briefly list below:

2. [REDACTED] said that Gregory Le [REDACTED] had just called him and asked him to meet, but since [REDACTED] was leaving the underground, he had to postpone the meeting with [REDACTED]. [REDACTED] had said on the phone that he was leaving for vacation (probably in the Soviet Union) on the 25th of June. [REDACTED] was to meet [REDACTED] one hour after we left him, that is, at 1500 hours. When [REDACTED] mentioned this, we suggested to him that he and [REDACTED] about the expectations in Turkey, but [REDACTED] replied that the question is a little bit too delicate for him to put to [REDACTED]. Although we asked [REDACTED] how long [REDACTED] would be gone, [REDACTED] said he did not know but would try to find out. In reference to your valid concern regarding [REDACTED]'s 01 relations with [REDACTED] (CIA-1346, 13 February 1968), we have occasionally suggested replies and comments be referred to handle [REDACTED], but almost without exception [REDACTED] has turned them down as inappropriate, just as he did on the above suggestion re Gregory. He would say that [REDACTED] is not quite the honest type that we have perhaps had acquaintances to believe in the past. So it is surprising in his apparent optimism and frankness, but we have noticed that he is also capable of being quite clever and sly when the occasion demands. If we have given the impression that he is single-minded, we would like to correct that impression. Any person that has managed to hold the job that he has for the second longest period of any man in the 45-year history of the [REDACTED] organization has to be more than a little man's man of the job. By the way, we learned from [REDACTED] that [REDACTED] is now and has been for some time an accredited Soviet consul. 01 01

3. Another topic which came up was audio operations. We asked [REDACTED] what the status of the surveillance operation on Tchitschikov was. He replied, contrary to his earlier optimistic version, that things were not going so smoothly. They had struck a last minute snag and were now having difficulty getting the person targeted to move out of the apartment. Of course, they can have the person staked, but that would attract undue attention; so they are trying to work around the situation. [REDACTED] still has hopes that during the course of the summer, they will be able to get this apartment or if not this one, another one close by.

4. The subject of audio operations for [REDACTED] started on a short note; namely, he expressed deep appreciation for the technical help which he was getting and cited a case which they say have gained, involving an audio operation against a Persian citizen suspected of working with the Soviets. Four men and one car are assigned to the operation which involves surveillance from early morning till late at night and which will probably go on for from two to four months.

01 [REDACTED] explained that they had broken the suspect's apartment by running the microphone in through an air duct and the microphones out through another air duct to the adjoining apartment where a man was consistently listening. One engine was at home. The car in the adjoining apartment was also in radio contact with the person standing by in the car so that the suspect could be followed wherever he left the apartment. 01 01 but as to say that it is operates is, of course, very inaccurate in terms of time, money and equipment in view of their limited staff, but he does feel that it is better to concentrate on one target at a time for the best results.

5. Other items brought up were the following:

a. Requested [REDACTED] if he could provide us with additional information of Soviet property in [REDACTED] 01 [REDACTED] recalled that the last time he [REDACTED] had been all that they had us back at that time. He promises to get if he could get you some from the appropriate persons in the [REDACTED] Ministry of the Interior.

b. [REDACTED] needed as a half-page memo concerning the investigation which has been conducted so far. In my opinion, until [REDACTED] is fully interviewed, the best result of this investigation will be that although [REDACTED] was characterized as benevolent and anti-American, he was not forced to be involved in any circumstances that could be considered as detrimental to U.S. interests. He was released as a Communist, politically sensitive. [REDACTED] will be kept under surveillance, how since we do not know, perhaps merely strict surveillance.

c. [REDACTED] also forwarded a page and a half report on an investigation of DELTA [REDACTED], also known as KATI. KATI is an individual who appears to be a local official in [REDACTED] section, Saar, c/o [REDACTED]. The name had been referred to the Consulate from Gothenburg. The investigation in this case involved not only going through the [REDACTED] files, but also through the files of the [REDACTED] section, plan on investigation by the local sheriff in [REDACTED]. We make a point of mentioning this merely to advise you that frequently [REDACTED] are used for this type of investigation which does not show in the production file for the [REDACTED] project at Headquarters. There appears to be some doubt now as to the accuracy of the information furnished by KATI, but before anything is sent to the Consulate in Gothenburg, we intend to check the matter out carefully.
