1. The Subject and his family left helsinki for good on 17 July 1956. [LOHNATES] had just returned from his second trip to the Soviet Union during the week of 9 - 13 July and was only in helsinki for four or five days prior to leaving for the United States via Europe. At the request, the Cultural Attache, Dr. Ctt, called LOHNATES DU into his office and asked him a few simple questions, such as, how was his trip to the USER, if he knew any Joviets in helsinki, and if so, which ones. According to Dr. Ctt, the Subject seemed quite anxious to answer all these ouestions and even offered to give fuller answers, if required. He added that he had taken many pictures while in the Soviet Union, some of which were of the Soviet officials he met in hoscow.

2. Since [Dis.173] had agreed to talk more at length with an American, Dr. Ott, as prearranged, told him that Mr. William Manefield would get in togeth with him over the week-end by phone and arrange to see him. [Dis.175] gave Ott the telephone number of his temporary residence, but the since two will and 17 July were rather busy at the since two KIRLEN case officers were here on TDY and required varying degrees of assistance. Both Andrew K. Reuteman and Harold K. Shands, the case officers in question, agreed to pose as william Manefield and do the Schriefing if they could find the time. - 4. [LOHMATE] is not identical with the Pulbright student Jane P. Kichline spoke of. That student is John H. HONGEN of Partworth College, who was debriefed by Harold K. Shands on 14 July. Do
- 5. The personalities of interest whom LANATAN has not seem to be CCLUB (fru), a poviet vice Counsul who is an assistant to Ivan SANATAN, and Yuri VORRAIM. He also not a Finnish Communist named RESA (fru), who was sitting with CCLUB and VCRONIN at a Finnish restaurant. On one occasion ICCHWATEN asked CCLUB over to his apartment for a drink and suggested that COLUB bring VORNIN and the Finnish Communist along them the Finnish Communist did not turn up dor a drink, [CHWATEN] asked his Russian guests why. One of the Russians allegedly replied that, "so do not like to associate with these Finnish Communists. Many of these Communists who would betray their own country would also betray us too; you can't trust them."
- 6. On one occasion ICHRATES saw the Pinn's passport and noted that he had travelled to practically every country in the world.
- 7. In LONGITUR'S USIS file there is a letter dated 16 April 1956, in which LONGATUR sake permission to go to the Soviet Union. The letter reads as follows:

"I have been invited by the Soviet Academy of Sciences to give one or two lectures in Moscow at the end of this week. The date of departure from Heleinki has not yet been fixed, but I should like to inform you at this time of the plane. The visit will not exceed three or four days.

Although USIS has been repeatedly briefed that the Embassy is interested in practically everything regarding the traval of persons in and out of the Soviet Elec, this item was not brought to the Embassy's attention.

8. Since the experiences of LOHWATER and MODELEM have many similarities, it is possible that [LOHWATER] took only one trip to the USSR; however, [MODESON] Obtook two, and the undersigned may be confusing the two cases. On the other hand, if [LOHWATER] went in April and his last date of entry from the USSR was in mid-July, it looks as if he took two trips also. However, his file only refers to one.

9. The fact that the above information is so spotty is a direct reflection on Dr. Ott's debriefing, which was very superficial because both he and the thought that Likharin could be debriefed in more detail before he left Finland.

13. This is the first time the Station has heard of Vice Consul CLUE. REMIN and SERVITA are, of course, well known. The Station would be very interested in all information [LARATEM] can give on COLUB and the Finnish Communist.
