1. Source invited to give lectures on math in USSR. Soon after receiving the invitation, he and wife were in bar of Helsinki restaurant, when subj and fm RASKE, a Finn Commie, came up to his table and introduced themselves. Subj mentioned source's imminent trip to USSR. Subj told [REDACTED] source to come to Sov Emb next day to meet the Cultural Attaché, who could arrange to get source to USSR and back without cost. Source invited subj and RASKE to his home for dinner following Sunday. Both accepted. SUBJ paid entire bill.
- When source went Sov Emb next day met Yuri VORONIN and subj, also SERGEIEV. V. invited himself to dinner with subj at source's home. Subj, VORONIN and wives went to source's for dinner, bearing many presents. RASKE did not come. Subj [REDACTED] told source "this RASKE is a swine." Felt that it necessary to use these Finn Commies politically but that they cannot be trusted.
2. Attended Consular Corps lunch on 10 Apr 57 and spoke to Columbian Consul.
3. Subj invited [VACCINE/1] to lunch with him 21 Jan 58, & told him how much he knows about what goes on in Finland.

1. Source believed Ivan Ye. SERGEIEV is subj's chief.
2. Subj is new Consul replacing Ivan SERGEIEV.
3. On 17 Dec 56 [VACCINE/1] went to farewell lunch with SERGEIEV and subj.
4. Great sense of humor, very quick, very sharp and witty. Constantly refers to self as Ukrainian. Wears double breasted suits - Western style. Main sport is skiing. Strong powerful handshake, piercing artifical glances, is very excitable, flirtatious and the I-know-it-all type. Loves to pat and shakes his head from side to side when he talks. Conversation implies that he is well-educated and knowledgeable on dip business, Marxism and current events involving the USSR. His knowledge of life beyond USSR is meagre. Table manners are fair.

Subj has recently complained to Johannes Virolainen that the Finn Security police were not paying any attention to cases of British & American espionage in Finland, adding that the Sovs had info re Western espionage in Finland & would be glad to furnish that info to the security police. On 31 Dec 57 VARIATION/1 told [REDACTED] that subj had visited Minister of Interior Kiukas in latter's office & said Sovs have positive proof that the security police has Western contacts - but gave no hint as to what proof Sovs have.

[CFA] 3512 4. Subj said [VACCINE/1] told him he was leaving for Moscow on the 25th of June. [VACCINE/1] was to meet subj at 1500.

[VACCINE/1] said that Gregory Ye GOLEB had just called him and asked him to lunch, but since [V/1] was seeing the undersigned, he had to postpone the meeting with GOLEB. GOLEB had said on the phone that he was leaving for vacation (presumably in the Soviet Union) on the 25th of June. [VACCINE/1] was to meet GOLEB one hour 01 after we left him, that is, at 1500 hours. When [VACCINE/1] mentioned this, we 01 suggested to him that he ask GOLEB about the executions in Hungary, but [V/1] 01 replied that the question is a little bit too delicate for him to put to GOLEB.  
01 Although we asked [VACCINE/1] how long GOLEB would be gone, [V/1] said he did not know 01 but would try to find out. In reference to your mild concern regarding [V/1]'s 01 relations with GOLEB (CFA 3548, 17 February 1958), we have occasionally suggested replies and comments designed to harass GOLEB, but almost without exception 01 [VACCINE/1] has turned them down as inappropriate, just as he did on the above suggestion re Hungary. We would say that [VACCINE/1] is not quite the honest Abe 01 that we have perhaps led Headquarters to believe in the past. He is deceiving in his apparent openness and frankness, but we have noticed that he is also capable of being quite clever and sly when the occasion demands. If we have given the impression that he is simple-minded, we would like to correct that impression. Any person that has managed to hold the job that he has for the second longest period of any man in the 50-year history of the [VACCINE/1] organization has to have more 01 than a simple cop's grasp of the job. By the way, we learned from [VACCINE/1] that GOLEB is now and has been for some time an accredited Soviet consul. 01

- [OPHA] 3127 7. Subj has asked [VANNUK] to try stopping NTS literature sent to Sov officials from Sweden last Spring and told [VACCINE] on 21 Jan 58 that the mailings had stopped. [VACCINE] when queried by subj said he had talked to two persons in Sweden re this. Subj was profuse in his thanks & said that it is a great step for his career that he will be able to report to Moscow that he has enough influence with [VACCINE] to get a job like this taken care of... When subj was asked by [VACCINE] "Are you the highest intelligence office the SU has in Finland?" subj protested that his interests were purely diplomatic and that he had no other than normal consular duties. As an additional comment to the conversation on the NTS matter, subj appeared highly pleased and remarked that Moscow had recently told him that his reporting was far better than anything SERGEYEV had done.

Subj said that he had been enjoying himself very much in Finland, liked Finland and the Finns. He said that he was glad that he did not speak English as he would then prob be sent to England or the US, which in his opinion were too far from his home in the SU. According to subj, this made travel home, as well as phone calls, too expensive. Subj said that he would like to be sent next to Moscow and that over three years was too long to be away from one's country.

16. On 21 May 1959, [VALIKA] was informed by subj that he had been summoned to Leningrad for a meeting with a representative of the Soviet Internal Security Police (presumably MVD). While there, subj. had been instructed to determine what security precautions the Police of Sweden, Norway and Denmark plan to take to insure the safety of KHRUSHCHEV during his August visit to the Scandinavian countries. During the conversation, subj was very critical of his Soviet colleagues in Stockholm, Oslo, & Copenhagen, for their failure to develop close relations with representatives of the Security Police of those countries. Subj was worried not only about his own inability to develop the information requested, but also for the safety of KHRUSHCHEV during this trip. Subj did not know for sure whether K. would visit Finland on this trip, but believed that if he did, it would occur after the visit to the other three countries, and that any visit to Finland would be purely unofficial.

17. Subj lives in a large sized apartment which is sparsely furnished with semi-modern and not particularly in good taste furnishings. No domestics seemed to be about. Subj invited [AEP/ME/5 and AEP/WME/3 to dinner & subj's wife served meal. After dinner he showed "Pickey House & Donald Duck" films & seemed to enjoy them tremendously. Subj stated that before his wife and he were married they had known each other for a long time and marriage just seemed to be the next step. He said that now he & his wife are "good pals", and he also mentioned that his wife, altho she liked Hels, did not like the weather which caused her a lot of sickness. When [AEP/5 said that the only thing for subj to do was to ask for a transfer as his wife's health is more important than his job, subj responded very quickly stating that she was wrong, that the job was certainly more important to him than his wife. Subj stated that he was an orphan and that the Communist system had given him everything.
- 02 Subj indicated that he knew about [AEP/3's contact in the USSR with Yurii KOLLOVSKIY whom she had met in the Bolshoy Theater & who had promised to send her records. (note that [AEP/3 had never told anyone 02 in Finland beside KHEARW [REDACTED] about this contact)...Subj discoursed 14 at length re Communism - (see report attached). On 23 June subj phoned [AEP/5 to say that his wife was leaving for holidays in Moscow and that there was some man in Moscow she loved better than her husband.
