1. Attached herewith is Arthur J. RAMSEY's contact report of a meeting with KARTEL on 22 August 1961. The purpose of this contact was to determine KARTEL's current relationship with the RIS, ascertain his future plans, and debrief him about his friend William Steinsmith, an American who lives in Copenhagen illegally, and who has written several pro-Castro articles for local newspapers. He is also known to maintain a contact since February 1961 with the local Cuban legation officer Gabriel Califora.
2. We have asked A SOURCE to interview Steinsmith, determine the reason for his living here illegally (without residence permit) and obtain as much additional data as possible about his source of income, activities, and contacts here.
3. We will keep Headquarters advised of future developments. This case has been discussed with THE FBI representative from London, who suggested that Headquarters coordinate this case with THE FBI in Washington.
4. Forwarded under separate cover are copies of KARTEL's consular file including documents concerning his newly acquired wife.



SUBJECT : Contact with KAWAER 29 August 1961

1. After several abortive attempts to locate and contact KAWAER on 20 August, it was finally established that since his return from Yugoslavia he has been residing at the Hotel "Kongens Nytorv" which address is c/o Mr. J. N. Andersen, vej 6, 11. 71 12 DK. This will be his address until his departure from Copenhagen, which will take place on 7 September. KAWAER was contacted first by telephone in the morning; hours of 79 August and then invited to come to a meeting at the Royal Hotel. The meeting took place at 10:00 and lasted until 12:30 hrs.

2. General matters

a) KAWAER traveled in Yugoslavia from 1 - 24 July (or about 3 weeks of that time). His wife accompanied him on this trip and apparently contributed the major share of their travel expenses.

b) After his return from Yugoslavia KAWAER married his present wife. As a wedding gift, his father sent him \$ 300.00, from which amount KAWAER paid \$ 40.00 for their passage to the USA, the rest went on living expenses and wedding presents. He is fit, he sent also an affidavit for KAWAER's wife, so that both can now travel together. They will leave Copenhagen on the "Stavangerfjord" on 2 September, traveling by tourist class.

c) In the beginning the couple will reside with KAWAER's parents (KAWAER himself will try to enrol at Sorøhøjgaard planned, though he is still not certain that he will be able to finance his studies). He has not yet received any scholarships or grants and will probably have to rely on the support of his parents, at least for the initial period. Since he has been alone, he has been able to earn only ca. DKK 200 by compiling a Russian word list for the "Internationale Institut" which plans to publish a Russian word count for a condensed language course. As to the reported purchase of furniture, KAWAER stated that they actually placed only an order for Danish furniture with the firm "Illums Bolighus" in the amount of DKK 2000 - 2100, but did not pay any money down. If they can afford it, they will write from the States and ask the firm to send the furniture in a later lot. The order is not really binding and if they cannot afford the deal, they will cancel it.

3. Contact with Soviets

KAWAER stated that since he had visited the Soviet Embassy on our instructions on 17 April, he had no further contacts with the Soviets and had not seen any officials or any Soviet citizens. No attempts have been made by the Soviets to contact him in any way, either.

4. Hotel in SWEDEN

He is still on duty in the course of the conversation KAWAER told that he would be en route to a residence in Sweden.

The interest in STEINER was explained by our desire to find out why an American citizen resided in Norway illegally. After the interview KNAUER was told that he should not reveal our interest in STEINER until "TO MYSELF", and he promised to do so.

b) According to KNAUER, William STEINER MEL, age 27-28, is a native of New York. His parents reside in Bronx, but their address is not known to KNAUER. He believes that the name is fairly sure and that it should be easy to trace their residence through the Bronx telephone directory. He studied at Keweenaw Community College located in New York (possibly at the City College) and in California (possibly at the UCLA). His major was education. STEINER MEL is a free-lance journalist and lives off freely from the sum or earnings of his journalistic work. TO KNAUER, STEINER MEL has no other source of income.

c) At the present time, STEINER MEL lives with his girl-friend, Tulla STEINER MEL, at Kirkevei 2. He is definitely not registered there. STEINER MEL came to Copenhagen about 6-7 months ago. Before that time he lived in Tromsø, Norway. He had a 1-year residence permit for Norway. As far as KNAUER knows, STEINER MEL has a residence in Scandinavian countries in due to his desire to be with his girl-friend. The latter is of Norwegian descent, but lives a longer time in the USA, where she married (final) STEINER MEL, possibly a year, from whom she separated (but when she did not formally divorce). She has a daughter, 10 years old, from that marriage, who is with her mother. KNAUER does not know anything about STEINER MEL, except that he is an American citizen. Tulla STEINER MEL moved from Norway to Copenhagen, allegedly to study clothes design, but at the present time she has no money to attend any school or courses. In general, the couple lives from hand to mouth. It one time during the last winter, when they passed through a particular hard period, they stayed with KNAUER.

d) KNAUER met STEINER MEL in winter 1960/61 and has been seeing him fairly frequently since spring 1961. KNAUER did not provide a clear picture of how he met STEINER MEL, but in the beginning it seems to have been a casual acquaintance through "a friend of a friend or a friend". In spring 1961 KNAUER translated one of STEINER MEL's articles on Cuba from English into Norwegian as a literary exercise. As a result of this work, they got to know each other more closely, but while they can be said to know each other well, KNAUER does not consider STEINER MEL a really close friend. In general, STEINER MEL is a quiet and reserved person. KNAUER characterized him as extremely well-read, interested in politics and economics, politically "left of the center". The articles of which KNAUER became familiar with him, the American situation, the USSR, etc., expressed an anti-American view of course, more recently, with Africa. The article on Cuba was published in the Danish journal "Aldersosen". Other articles were published in "Altsemt" and "Information". STEINER MEL writes only in English. He does not know any foreign languages well and has no great knowledge of French and Spanish. He does not speak German, but speaks some.

KNAUER was asked to say anything he knew about STEINER MEL's background. He knows only that prior to his return to Norway, STEINER MEL worked in New York as a sort of clerk or messenger boy for the American C.I.A. organization.

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tion. KNAUER believes that STEINMETZ has not traveled extensively and it is possibly limited only to exile (when he studied in California) and Norway and Denmark.

KNAUER knows STEINMETZ only under this name and has never learned directly or indirectly that STEINMETZ could have used another name. He has seen an article written by STEINMETZ, which was signed by "STEIN METZ", but that seems to be only a spelling variation of the same name.

j) In connection with STEINMETZ's article on Cuba, STEINMETZ visited the Cuban Embassy. In this capacity he met and got acquainted with the Cuban Charge d'Affaires, Gabriel CALLEGARI, a very intelligent and brilliant young man; he is a very good linguist and knows English, French, Chinese, possibly some Portuguese. KNAUER himself was introduced to CALLEGARI and has met him at least 3-5 times. Initially, THE INRRA and KNAUER even planned to exchange some language lessons, but after two lessons their efforts petered out. GENE MA, according to KNAUER, is a 1% "fascist", strongly anti-American, but has some reservations concerning the Russians and Communism, at least in his utterances towards KNAUER. The nature of contacts between CALLEGARI and STEINMETZ is not really known to KNAUER. He does not believe that STEINMETZ, through KNAUER, serves as a rather independent person, performs any particular services for CALLEGARI and doubts very much that STEINMETZ gets any money from CALLEGARI. As stated before, STEINMETZ's material situation is very poor. The only material guarantee he has is an assurance from his parents that they will pay his passage back to the United States.

k) KNAUER stated that STEINMETZ plans to return to the United States within 1-2 months. He will probably go to New York.

l) According to KNAUER who is aware of the fact that STEINMETZ resides in Denmark without a residence permit, the only known reason for STEINMETZ's coming first to Norway and then to Denmark was his desire to be with his girl friend (Tulla ZEMANOVIC). At one point, STEINMETZ told KNAUER that since he was planning to go back to the United States pretty soon, it did not really matter whether he had or had not a residence permit. In short, vis-a-vis KNAUER STEINMETZ represented his illegal residence as a case of personal negligence and indolence and as purely connected with personal reasons.

m) Summarizing the somewhat impressionistic data on STEINMETZ, KNAUER stated that he considers the man to be "quite progressive", but not necessarily Communist. On the other hand, STEINMETZ is not a type to baffle easily and though KNAUER has been knowing him for quite some time, he cannot make the claim to know him well. However, KNAUER does not believe that STEINMETZ is on any one's pay roll.

#### 5. COMMUNIST PERSPECTIVE

a) KNAUER discussed STEINMETZ fairly frankly and without any visible mental reservations, but he obviously did not provide a complete

pictures of the men and their relationship. In all fairness to KAWERKA he is not a bad reporter in general, is not a very keen observer, and is not always able to concentrate on the topic at hand. But from the tenor of the interview and KAWERKA's total lack of any serious information, it would be quite reasonable to assume that the questioning concerning KAWERKA's father has been personally. He does not seem to have any guilt feelings concerning his relationship with STEINKAMP and it is very unlikely that the latter has been cultivating KAWERKA on behalf of the RPK, if it is assumed that STEINKAMP has no contacts.

b) KAWERKA's financial status has not been clarified completely, but his gift of £ 100.00 from his father in connection with KAWERKA's wedding and increasing dowry from Germany does not seem to be unusual. In KAWERKA's description of his father's business, the latter has a small enterprise and is certainly not a wealthy man, but he has some modest means and savings.

#### 6. Final instructions:

a) KAWERKA asked for instructions for the event of a contact by the Soviets and was told that if such contacts and attempts of contacts should occur in the United States, he would have to contact the FBI immediately.

Arthur J. Rooney
