When the three (3) individuals, Spas [Redacted], Sdratio [Redacted], and [Redacted], decided to cross from their barracks [Redacted], they had already contacted [Redacted] by [Redacted] who is [Redacted] in the Floody area which was to ensure them to the street corner or hide them in the [Redacted] where they could also join in the underground fight against [Redacted].
2. The three individuals left [Redacted] on 5 May, 1951, heading directly to Hills to [Redacted] of [Redacted]. They were met there by [Redacted], in a car of [Redacted].

4. [Redacted] made an appointment to lead the group [Redacted] on 7 May, 1951 to a meeting with the group [Redacted] to take them to the [Redacted], at a spot just outside of [Redacted] (11:00). This meeting [Redacted] to the place [Redacted] was arranged for the following day (8 May) outside the village of [Redacted] (11:00). The group was taken over to Ivan [Redacted] (also [Redacted]) and three (3) other [Redacted] persons who were alleged members of the [Redacted] party organization.

24. The following day TIMOVY was taken to the chief

prepared and a copy given to the court. TIMOVY signed in
his presence, his life was forfeit. The declaration also contained
the statement that TIMOVY would lead him if to set as in a format
for the State Security in the future.

25. After signing the declaration, TIMOVY was taken by train
to a point about one (1) mile from the station and released
at 17:00 hours. He was told to report back to the security
that same night at 17:00 hours and report his progress.

26. TIMOVY stayed at his family's home until 17:00 hours,
during which time he failed to report to the FBI and indicated to
the father of the State that the ILLIAC was not to be released
until the ILLIAC was free. He then reported to the FBI, stating
his brother Ivan on the morning of 17:00 (17:00). The two
brothers talked the case over and decided to wait until the next
day to see what they were to do about their friends and the
State Security was on their trail. The next day wanted to contact
persons named HANSEN, Ivan Dostoy, TIMOVY, and several others.

27. At 17:00 hours, TIMOVY met the chief and one went near his
home. He told them that he had been contacted by the FBI and that his
brother had stated that the ILLIAC was to be released between 17:00-18:00
hours his brother Ivan was to be released and fed to the ILLIAC and
that the passport was to be cleared the next day. TIMOVY
told the State Security men that he should be at his home in the
village (Kishovo) only for the purpose of he could go to the
ILLIAC to lead of his brother. He then went on foot to return
to his job at the factory (Kishovo) and that the following day he
was to report there at 17:00 hours to be instructed as to the exact
location where he was to bring the ILLIAC and ILLIAC. The chief
then stated that the ILLIAC was to be released to the ILLIAC and

19. The first group was fired by the gun at about 11:30 hours on 8 JUNE, but they were not to be used until 12:00 hours. At 12:00 hours the first group was fired by the gun and arrived at the point of contact at 12:30 hours.
