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Jose PUNTE Planco

RETURN TO CIA  
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During his university days, Jose, who is now RAI's Secretary for Student Youth, was a well known Cuban student leader, who was later to become the first president of the FEU after Castro came to power.

As a student leader in 1953 PUNTE was elected president of the Havana University Student Union. At that time he and his brother, Roberto got into trouble with Batista, so in 1955, when Batista closed the university, PUNTE continued to conspire against Batista and eventually had to escape to Venezuela in order to save his neck. He subsequently came to the U. S. In 53 he left the US and found his way into the Escambray mountains where he joined anti-Batista forces, not necessarily Castro forces, for there were many & anti-Batista groups in the mountain at that time. He did, however, join Castro forces as the campaign neared its climax.

After the successful revolt, PUNTE ~~████████████████████~~ returned to Havana University to continue his law studies. He was elected the FEU president in a close election against students backed by Castro.

After graduation PUNTE worked with INIT, a Cuban Tourist Commission, but in late 1952 he became convinced that the Castro movement was "not for him" and soon began to conspire against Castro.

In early 1960 PUNTE went underground and reportedly stayed sub rosa until the Bay of Pigs invasion at which time he came out to assist in the uprising. However, in the ensuing ~~████████~~ roundup of opposition groups, Jose and his brother, Roberto, were caught and imprisoned. According to PUNTE, he tried to escape twice and was caught both times.

After nearly nine months in prison, Jose and his brother, Roberto were released by Castro as the result of direct intervention by Melania Simo, Deputy to the Cubanian National Assembly and extraordinarily pro-Castro, who was approached by Punte's mother in Florida and called to air, to try to get her sons freed. In March 1961, ~~████████~~ men were released and reportedly returned to Cuba to freedom.

It is a known fact that Jorge Mili, ~~████████~~, a member of <sup>11-1-1962</sup> ~~████████~~ of Jose's is working for James BLODGETT, the CIA agent, and is living in Argentina at present.

Comments:

One could probably and perhaps properly ~~infer~~ that Jose is a Castro agent, but aside from the episode dealing with his release, at the behest of Thelma King, and the report that he carried with him, after his release from prison, 150 scholarships, which appears to have some significance, there is no conclusive evidence pointing toward Jose's involvement, in past or present, with Castro's security apparatus.

There is, however, considerably more evidence that he is not an agent of Castro; For example:

1. He has fought against Castro and was imprisoned by him.
2. ~~that~~ He has reportedly denounced Thelma King openly.
3. ~~that~~ He does not get along with his brother Jorge, who is tied in with Piniero.
4. He has broadcasted anti-Castro and anti-Batista propaganda from Radio CIENMIL, a panamanian station.
5. ~~that~~ he is anti-Castro, Anti-Communist and pro-democratic and that his actions, according to Jose, since 1953 should speak for themselves, including his actions and propaganda work against Castro since his arrival in the United States.

I don't believe I'm that naive to think that Jose's actions to date could not be part of a pre-arranged plan, but the evidence available points in the other direction.

I do suggest ~~two~~ two possible alternatives, the first of which I prefer:

1. Apprise Ray of this information and let him determine Puente's bona fides; caution him to be discreet with his future plans and avoid telling PUFNIE
2. Let us determine PUENTE's bona fides by re-tracing, including Bureau checks and AGC/T files. Determine his relationship with Jorge in Dma and attempt to ascertain whether he is <sup>and plausible</sup> corresponding with him. If desired, we could ~~begin~~ begin a mail intercept. In line with your thoughts re not being an intell unit for RAY, I ~~recommend~~ suggest the former proposal.
