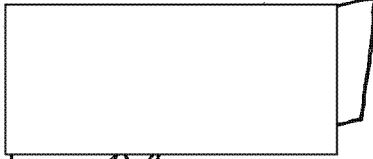
MEMORANDUM FOR THE RECORD:

12 March 1964

SUBJECT: Richard ^{OSWALD} Snyder 201-748009

1. Sometime late in 1956, Mr. Nelson H. Brickman informed me that a friend of his, Richard A. Snyder, an FSO was studying at Harvard preparatory to being assigned to the American Embassy, Moscow. The purpose of Mr. Brickman's remarks to me ~~XXXXXX~~ was to provide me simply with the facts in the event there was a possibility I might be interested in utilizing Mr. Snyder in any possible way during his assignment in Moscow.

2. Since policy dictated that we could not coopt an FSO going to Moscow without (a) DDP's approval and (b) State Department's knowledge and approval, I did nothing about it. I did not meet or ever talk to Mr. Snyder.
