LINTRODUCTION

Very briefly we have gone over his history from his school days up to the present time and we have gone over in general what documents he has brought, seed what his work in Intelligence is and what he knows that would a pear to be most significant to the present time . I am going to go over this fairly rapidly in English so that you will be (cot) up to date with me. He did engage in some ten or twolve fights, there is, fire-fights, during the time he was with Indernation to When the Butista Government fell in January 1959, the column with which he was nta Lyre de Cuba and he went to Ihvana with Miro Mardenes and a group of fellows close to Miro. got there he was assigned to the investigator, department which at that time was headed by Aldo Verez Scrafin, and His particular job in this investigating department was to conduct investigations of illegal gambling, that is, gambling which was done outside of the cabares and the gambling houses. He stayed in that job until Hovember of 1959 when he was transferred to the 18th. precinct, a police station. he was the second chief, and He stayed there and he stayed until January of 1961. At that time he was transferred to National Police Meadquarters but he did not have any operful assignment he was the stand-by officer and ho-stayed there without having any specific duties. He just signed the roster in the morning and took off, until the end of 1961 at which time he was transferred to a police buttalion and He

remained with the police batallion until September of 1961. At this time he was transferred to the Castill @ da-Moro to study. This was a basic study and did not have anything to do with intelligence work. He was in school there until until, December of 1961 when he got holiday leave. He decided that he did not want to stay in the Army anymore became this police work was still an assignment while he was in the Army. He had already began to have doubts about continuing to work for the Castro jovernment and was thinking in terms of getting out. When he resigned from the Army his papers were not processed right away was he did not report and he was reported for being away without leave. Decause of this difficulty he had some difficulty getting work and 🗯 was out of work until April 1962, when he got a job in the Ministry of Exterior Commerce, the particular section in which he worked had to do with the importation of vel and He remained there until August of 1963, and He had a friend named Saul Gonzalez who was an intelligence officer and through this friend he got a job in Intelligence. This particular friend is either the Chief or the 2nd Chief of what they call the illegal section - this is a section which specializes in training agents for assignments abroad, particularly in Latin America. When our friend here began working in Intelligence he was assigned to the Salvadordn Indexication t is the area about which he himself knows most from his own personal knowledge. This Intelligence Service for which he worked is called Section (in loose language but is properly known as Directon General Intelligencia.

If however they want to send someone out (such as himself on this trip to Mexico, for a short T.D.Y. they just say give us a passport and such a name as its issued and no fuss or frill about it. situation is a little different where a passport or visa is to be secured for travel to one of the "Cocialist" countries. Wew in order partly to establish his own bona-fide his own good faith he brought us these documents from the files so that he could show that he was not inventing, and the documents which he brought out, in general, are these that I will go over right now. He brought out some passports, he says there are sens falsified Cuban passports, that is, they are falsified in the scree that they are issued in other than a true name and some légitimate passents which have been secured in various Latin American countries. He also brought out some podular, which are identity documents, which were issued for trainees who came to Cube for training. Parenthetically, I might mention one thing on which I did not make a note which is quite interesting. Post of the trainees who have come to Cuba have come outer training and then will go back and export the revolution

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in their own countries. -ut when thece people are in Cuba for this type of para-military training he and other officers like him would select those that they thought nost useful for intelligence purposes and these would be separated from . the group and would be trained for intel igence missions without the knowledge of the others and without the knowledge of the Communist Party which sponsored the sending of the people to Cuba. "He also brought out one Hexican passport which is of interest in that this was of secured through a contact of the Communist Party beergine of the Communist Lenter in El Salvador, and it was sent to Cuba to be used in covering the travel of somebody that they might want to send in and did not have documents or who wouldhave to travel in a nationality other than his own. 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What I am doing here is going over these things and trying to sort them out in different envelopes so we can get back to then whenever we need them before they are stuck away inthe file. As I am doing it, I am sorting that out that people who are Staff Officers as distinct from people who are Agents working outside under the direction of the Staff I Officers covered so far we have one whose name is Ivrgome-Wille. This man is located in Prague, Czechoslovakia in the Cuban Embassy and our friend here, Rodriguez was given a letter of introduction to him by another Headquarters Staff Officer. The Staff Officer at Headquarters who prepared the letter is better 'mown under the pseudonym Agusto. He is also referred to as Chair which might or might not be his true name, but he is often reforred to by that name in the Hinistry of Poreign Relations, man is a Deputy to the Head of the Service, in other words, he is number two man in the Service and he replaces the Mond of the Service named/Piniers when Miniers is on trips.

A Third Stuffer whom we have covered up to the present time of Julio Damaso Vazouez and mulio Domasoo Vacouz, Vacous is the last neme and he used the internal recudency Sergio, and I will tell you a little bit more about him later in connection with one of the

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agents. Now The agents whom we have covered we have covered incidentally to those people who came to Cuba from other countries for guorilla training. Of these people some are solected to be agents, but We are just taking them as we get them to keep things in order diherwise we would be hopping around like grasskoppers.) Of those who came for training I have made a list of names. I won't go over all the names because they would not mean too much at this stage, except that What I have done here has been to note the name, the nationality whether or not he does know then personally. The ones who not only received guerilla training but who are agents are the ones of course we are most interested in, and they are first of all a man whose last name is SOSA. This man is a Monduran Citizen and probably is in Costa Rica at the present time. It is the opinion of Vladinir Rodriguez here that Sosa was deported from Honduras, and they refer to his case as the International Case because everybody in the family seems to have different Citizenship. He travelled with his family, and The Grandmother had one Citizenship and the cilla had another and so on and-so It was protty well nessed up as far as that is concerned. This fellow SOSA was given training as an Agent and His training covered the use of radio, the use of codes speciphers and the use of secret writing ghd He was given an accomodation address. Now this man, as I mentioned before, had a case officer and I listed the case officer or the staffer up above. I will give you the rest of the data on the staffer now.

The Staffers name is Fulio Denasco Vascaz with the pseudonym Sergio, and Viccimir has known him for some years. He describes him as being about 5' 5", hus'ty, sometimes called the Hawain because he is a light coloured molatto ... In addition to the training of any Agent the Case Officer as himself has received similar training, that is training in secret writing, codes, deciphers and radio. The also received training in parachute school, the Case Officer. The Case Officer was trained for an assignment in Central America but he is still in Cuba." The next case we have which is of particular interest because the man is trained as an agent is on a fellow name Regay DAITON, Dalton is a Salvadoran citizen and his family seems to be mixed up too because his father now deceased, was a United States Citizen and three of his brothers are United States Citizens, bho of them is said to have fought on Olinewa. To also has a sister MARITALITA named Harguarita who is a Mexican Citizen and who now is studying in Cuba. Our friend here remembers this case very well because he himself was the Case Officer for Dalton and he gave Dalton six hundred dollars to buy a radio receiver. apt Palton, instead of buying the radio receiver took a little trip for himself, and lived high, and spent the money so he has never come on the air, However he was given frequencies which he should use for radio transmission, und HE was supposed to send on the second Honday of each Month. The frequencies on which he was supposed to communicate were filmed and then the bits of film were rolled up and put in a false heel on his shock as a concealment device.

Now the accomplation address for Acevero Planco, and the address is Police Colonia Santa Tomas Zone 17, Mexico, Eccent District. The envelope and there is an envelope in the file which helifant brought with him for this case shows a return address, and Mr. Rodriguoz here cays that the return address in no case makes any difference because they always just invent anyone at all so that it cant be traced back. How far as we have gotten. Obviously my interest in cases like this, live cases, is considerable because there might be a possibility of doing something about those who are still in place, ee When I wrap it up here today I am going to have to do a little work to try to get these things brought to the attention of the proper people. Our difficulty in proceeding, of course is these things are so mixed up, thet If I try to just pull out the live ones we are going to have quite a bit of confusion. I think the best thing is to sort them once and for all as I get through it and then I will always be able to get back to the proper thing, explore," in a little more depth.

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Usually /I think we went over this yesterday) when there is som body in Cula whether for Agent training as an Intelligence Agent or whether he is in Cuba for training as a guerilla fighter he would be given on leaving Cuba two passports - one of which would be a Cuban passport intended to get him only as far as Prague and the other of which he would use for his travel from Frague back to his own country. He has given ne these three passports, I did not get into the matter of how it was he had then and his explanation is this that these three people did leave Cuba using their own legitimate passports, and the reason they used their legitimate passports in the three cases was simply that there was not time for the Intelligence Service there to get these three passforts, which we have in hand, ready with the proper caches. When they issue a passport to cover a man's travel they will stamp in the back pages of the passport a cache such as Orlic Airport, France with the dates that would correspond with a period during which he actually was in Cuba. They select the countries, the osenes which they will use for this proose in accordance with whether a man of that hationality would or would not have to have a visa for the country.

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For example, most Latin Americans could go to France without any visa so then France is a good country for them to use as then they do not ly vo to duplicate or forge i. Freich visa. All they have to do in to put in the onole for arrival in Orlic Airport. They pick a number of countries like this that do not require visas and they put these stamps in the back of the passporte so the individual raking trips in Europe during the time he was really undergoing his training, and In these particular instances whose has gotten these passports they were = passports intended to be used but not actually used because there was no time. Something else which is quite interesting to you as well as to me is that those Cuban passports with the fall notice with have five stamp digits of this type, these are all filsified in the y names falsified, all false. The five figure runber stamped like this he says are all false. In other words the Intelligence Service there uses this type of strain, always in a just five digits and they moust en that ip is one of their own passports. Another thing which is interesting that we have clarified here today is that the name which is used in the passport is a false name used simply to cover a man's trip. It is not a matter of permanent record so if he were to go back to Cuba he would not use that name again. We talked about the type of pseudonym which is assigned to the person for instance during the time that he is undergoing his training in Cuba, something completely different, That is his permanent pocudonym.

If the individual should return to Cuba at a later date he would use precisely the same one le had before. This was a matter Vladimir tello us of some discussion because 🚅 when they started out, they senetimes had assigned a different pseudonym for training pruposes to a fellow, but an his first trip into Cuba, leto say for guerilla warfare training, he was given a pseudonym, John bowe and then he made has second trip and they indigiven him another pseudonym. This posed some complications because when this happened they would have two separate files on the same individual and so they had a mosting and they decided that in the future, they would always keep the same training pseudonym. Of the ones we have covered today there is only one of particular interest. the rest are trainees and we will get all of these together at one time. /The one of particular interest is the case of a follow who has one of the tost and in & Spanish country, Colicio BEMARN TO Consales Moreno. This man is an Intelligence Agent, he is a Micaraguan by nationality. He presently is back in Bicaragua and he uses the feurcation address of Isabet Rodriguez, (stops-here) Altos, Nedonia Hervertai, Mexico, D.P., so that, in this particular case Dtharinto would always write to this accompodation address and then that letter would be mailed to Cuba Intelligence. Wow This is the only such case that we have covered to-day. The one other thing 42 of some interest is that everytime there is a request such as that which was in this envelope addressed to a Doctor for International Control on the stationery of the Institute of

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Mulano and the under-side the nest prevalice which they call That from the intial letters, It indicates that there is an intelligence interest in the guy. Hornally its a Cuban without any connection with the Intelligence wanting to get a vaccination for travels; He would have to go to the police station and he would get it on police stationary. but when it is arranged by SMAP this is arranged, by Intelligence and it is a request from Fifth caying that the bearer who is so and so should get a vaccination. So it is indivative of some intelligence connection request for vaccination on Birth stationary. OThere are a things that are interesting be brought with him chees a package of cables which had been sent to the Cuban Intelligence Officer in Mexico from Meadquarters or from the Lexican Intelligence to Meadquarters. A couple of them are interesting because they deal with the re-activation of a Invedicular or an accomplication address and it concerns procisely the Ledidray which is used by this follow Slicio Dtharinto, the same follow that I mentioned before. commenting on this f this is very interesting - Yhadimir tells me that the signature on Meadquarters cables, Pablo, Which is the name for Faul in Spanish really does not mean anything except that it comes from Intel Hondquarters It is not the pseudonym of a person, However the other name on the cable, Dulonio is the pseudonym used for the Intelligence Chief in Mexico who has been until the 16th. of April. Miredo Mirivelle, and who now will be Manuel Days recently arrived.
