Some difficulty was initially encountered in arranging a meeting with AkwHIP/2 during his current visit. He telephoned BUNCE's home on 20 May 1966, having reached Rome that day, and an appointment was made for the following day. He was forced to cancel, however, because business took him to Florence. On 22 May he telephoned to say that AMWHIP/1 and his cirlfriend (See OIMA)726079, 16 December 1964) were in town. Because AMWHIP/2 does not want AMWHIP/1 to know of his (A/2's) association with KUPARK (and the undersigned heartily agrees) he said that he would call back when the coast was clear. Arrangements were finally made for dinner on 24 May, when BUNCE's wife was also present, and lunch on 25 May. 2. AMWHIP/2 was told that we should like to maintain contact with him after BUNCE leaves Home, but that the person who would be in touch with him was not yet on the scene. After some hesitation he said that he was willing to meet a successor on two conditions. The first was that he would be handled by the successor as he has been handled in the past. Comment: AMWHIP/2 meant that he was willing to continue to provide information on the present basis - i.e., that he is unpaid, that his cooperation is voluntary, and that he will not be required to engage in activity which could endanger his security or business.) The second condition was that he would continue to be handled by a senior person, because for security reasons he wants knowledge of his contact to be as tightly restricted as possible. Comment: AMWHIP/2 has no knowledge, of course, of BUNCE's position but has always assumed that it is important.) AMWHIP/2 was assured that both conditions would be met. 3. The current address and telephone number of AMWHIP/2 are being forwarded as Identity A of the separate cover attachment to this dispatch. The telephone numbers of his shap and apartment in Home are included as Identity B. AWWHIP/2 was told that at an indefinite future date he will receive a telephone call at his store or home apartment. The caller will say, "I am a friend of Don. - 5. AMWHIP/2 speaks Spanish, Cerman, and French fluently but
- 6. AMWHIP/2 then asked if BUNCE's duties would not bring him back to Europe occasionally and thus permit a continuation of the present arrangement, through meetings in Coneva or elsewhere in Europe He was told that no definitive answer is possible now and that if such a trip materializes BUNCE will call on him but that he need have no qualms about contact with BUNCE's successor.
- 7. He was asked if he had heard anything further from Antonio Maria CARRILLO Carreris, 201-349956, since the latter's return to Cuba. ANWHIP/2 said that he had not. Pretending not to recall clearly what ANWHIP/2 had said in August of 1965 about arranging lodgings for CARRILLO in Benidorm, Spain (see OIRA-41342. 25 August 1965, not to Chief, VH, Chief, JNWAVE, COS or COB BUNCE asked if it were not true that ANWHIP/2 and wife had gone to Benidorm with CARRILLO Comment: The purpose of this cambit was to get ANWHIP/2's reaction to the query, because OSMA-20019, 3 September 1965, reported that CARRILLO was vacationing in Benidorm during part of the time ANWHIP/2 was indee; whereas ANWHIP/2 had never mentioned their simultaneous presence there.) ANWHIP/2 said calmly that while he was in Benidorm he arranged for vacation quarters there for CARRILLO but that CARRILLO, on arrival, did not like the place and the another. He added that he (A/2) and wife left Benidorm shortly before CARRILLO marrival and thus did not actually meet him there.
- 8. Meither ARVHIP/2 nor his wife has heard anything further from ARVEST/1.
- 9. Per OKLW-23055, 11 May 1966 (not to A was not given any specific facts about Josef Wilhelm FROTZ. AMUHIP/2 asked if he had seen FROTZ again and said yes. He met FROTZ recently (about 23 May 1966) at the Hilton Hotel. FROTZ said he had been very busy but expected soon to have time for a deal if AMWHIP/2 is interested. Or it seems that FROTZ's uncle is a bishop in Cormany (as report-9420, 22 Barch 1966). The Catholic church is engaged in ed in smultling valuable art objects out of Hungary (and perhaps other European satellites, though AMWHIP/2 does not know the latter as a fact) in order to reaise money. FROTZ sets these objects from his uncle and sells them, actually or ostensibly for the church. AMYHIP/2 would like to get into the act, which he believes is lucrative. He explained that FROTZ has on deposit in a bank in Switzerland a cold-colored or cold-plated statue weighing about three kilos and priced at about 25,000 Swiss francs. The statue came from Hungary. AWWHIP/2 thinks he has a buyer. AMWHIP/2 had taken the precaution of checking with a Cerman credit rating outfit in Germany, however, and had learned that FaOTZ had twice been charged with passing bad checks. To AMWHIP/2's direct request, BUNCE said only that FROTZ is an East-West trader who seems to have something of a reputation for fraud. AMWHIP/2 said that he would like to try to do business with FROTZ, both because he may be involved in matters of some intelligence interest and because he thinks that he (A/2) could thus make some money. A/2 may no real danger in the association, now that he has been warned and his eyen are open. 22
- 10. Para, 1 b of CAMA 20069, 3 September 1965 mays that Agail 17/2's wife told 201-140649 that she had made reservations for the Findskin Connul in tenes in Benidorm and later confirmed the reservations in a personal phone call to the Consul." BUNCE therefore asked AMMHIP/2 if he knows the Cuban Consul in tenos, Esther ROERICUES Colon (201-340050). He could not resember her by name or job! Comment. It is believed that his answer was truthful and that he does not also MURRICUES but that his wife may know her.)

- Reference was made above to the presence of AMWHIP/1 in Home, as had also been announced before his arrival by DIRKCTOR -16 April 1966. AMWHIP/1 sent preetings to BUNCE via AMWHIP/2 AWWHIP/2 reports that A/1's infaturation with his mistress is stronger than ever and that he is starting to think about a divorce. AMWHIP/2 says that AWWHIP/1's wife is much more attractive than his mistress. but that the mistress pays him much attention, whereas the wife tends to ignore him. AMhHIP/2 also reported that during the day of 24 May 1966 AWHIP/1 and mistress, in a car, were on the Tia Veneto and say a car starting to pull out from the curb. AMWHIP/1 waited for the empty space; but as he did so, another car shot past him and usurped AMHIP/1 got out of his car and reprinanded the Italian driver. The latter also left his car, words were exchanged, and with a single punch ANWHIP/1 knocked the Italian out. The Italian was unconscious for ten minutes. All involved were taken to a police station. As of 25 May AMWHIP/2 did not know further developments. Comment: It is essential that the fore, oing, which is reported solely a an aid to the continuing assessment of ANNHIP/I, should not be made known to him, directly or by alluston, unless Headquarters has alread received the same information from another source and unless Beadquarters is positive that AMWHIP/1 will not spot or even suspect AMWHIP/2 as the source. It will be recalled that AMWHIP/2 furnished somewhat similar information about AMWHIP/1 on a previous occasion and that when this information was reported, some asked in para. 8 of QIMA38996, 16 December 1964, that no consequent action be taken which could endanger the source. Whether it was the information contained in CIRA 38995 or something else concerning ANWHIP/1 is not known (because ANWHIP/2 refused to specify) but ANWHIP/2 became convinced (as he still is) that something that he told to BUNC about ANWHIP/1 was repeated to the latter by his Headquarters case officer and that the result was to endanger a twenty-year friendship and long-standing business partnership. (See para. 5 of OIKA 21342, 25 August 1965.) If AMWHIP/2 were again confronted by an angry22 AMWHIP/1 and accused of such reporting, AMWHIP/2 would undoubtedly be furious and would sever his relationship with KURAKK.
- 12. Rejarding his association with AMLASH/1, AMAHIP/2 repeated the information reported in OlkA 41342. He mays that on the occasion reported in that disputch AMLASH/1 was so drunk that AMMHIP/2 followed him into the bathroom because he feared that he would pass out and perhaps hurt himself. Meferring to AM#HIP/2 and others, who were in the living room, AMLASH/1 said, "They are all some of prostitutes! You are the only decent man here." As was his curtos, AMWHIP/2 had cone for a long walk as soon as AMLASE/1 and others appeared at AMBHIP/1's apartment. He stresses that he made every effort not to be involved in the plannin, and to know nothing about it and that ANLASH/1 was well-aware of this fact. Only on the reported occasion did ho chance to return before AMLASH/1 and associates had left. ANNHIP/2 therefore concludes that if AMLASH/1 mentioned his name at all under interrogation and told the truth, AMSHIP/2's position vis-a-vis the regime has not suffered. The contact arrangement explained in para. 4, above, has the defect that AM HIP/2 is away from Rose for lengthy periods and that contact depends on telephoning him at his Rome store or agent ment. It is suggested that he say only that he is a potential client who wishes to deal with ANNHIP/2 personally and duquire when ANNHIP/2 is expected to be in some. Making a second call at that time or a little later, the case officer may learn that A/2 has still not arrived. If a real hitch develops, it is suggested that the case officer call AMWHIP/2's heme in Geneva and use the recognition signal given above.
