- 1. Forwarded herewith is a picture of MARKE. Although the picture was taken in 1957, he looks today exactly as he did then, with the exception of a few less hairs on the top of his head. Description: 42 years old, apparent age 45, height 6 ft. I in., thin build, hair dark brown, large ears, right ear lobe has distinct inverted-y cut; above his left eyebrow is a parmanent lump (does not show on the attached picture), large enough so that it cannot be overlooked; walks with head and shoulders bent slightly forward; speaks German and French fluently and can pass as a netive of France; on a scale of excellent, very good, good, fair, poor, his English is rated good. If English is used with him, it should be spoken slowly and distinctly, choosing words which leave no doubt as to what is meant.
- 2. HAHREL was met in Luxembourg by RAFMEY and Elliott S. JOUVENOY, COS, Luxembourg, on 19 and 20 October. [AUDA] 234 had not been received in Frankfurt by the time of RAFMEY's departure from there for Luxembourg, but arrangements were made to have it relayed to Luxembourg, and JCTVEMOY has confirmed his receipt of it. The following sub-paragraphs provide the substance of the meetings with MARKEL:
- a. In view of the extreme sensitivity of the objective for which we want him to perform his task, he was not told precisely what we want him to do. Instead, he was told that we have evidence of Soviet operations among nationality groups in Africa, specifically, Corsiuans, and that we would like to have him spot, assess, and recommend some dependable, quick-witted persons for our use. (Comment: It was thought best to withhold our true, specific requirements pending the final decision to use MANIEL.) He agreed to go on the trip for us.
- b. Regarding cover for the trip, MARKEL suggested that he travel as a salesman for a German firm producing coin-operated soft-drink, coffee, etc., machines. He already had a brochure from this company and stated that he could easily obtain an authenticating to-whom-it-may-concern letter from the owner. The firm is SCHWEIMER RISERVERK, MUELLER AND CO., CHEM, SCHWEIM, WESTFALIA: the owner

is Brick IIPEERLY, who is asserted by MARKE to be a friend. (Comment: Eqs. traces have been run on the firm and the owner, with megative results.)

- e. MARKEL stated that in dealing with Corsioens it is semotimes advisable to give a Corsioan as a reference. If he finds this edvisable or necessary, his reference will be Jacques Sistrali, 75, Blvd. inguste Blanque, Paris. (Comments Eqs. traces have been give on Sistralia with negative results.)
- d. Since MHEEL is known to the Surete in Paris because of his assistance to the U.S. Buyeau of Marcotics, he was told to obtain visas for his trip in Carmany. His passport was reviewed, and there appeared to be no objection to his using it for the upcoming trip.
- e. He was told what immunitation shots and malaria suppressive he will need and was given funds to obtain them.
- f. He was told that contact with an American would be available at his destination in case he needs it. (Comment: Paras. 2 and) of AUDA 234 take case of this for MUTEROX's brisfing purposes.) He was not told that the person meeting his would be from the American Echassy, nor should be be told this.
- 3. Related gave JOUVISOI the same briefing concerning our purposes as he bad given to COS, ______ Botes were left with JOUVISOI for his use in briefing MARKEL specifically on the types we want MARKEL to find for us. Those notes, ______ plus ATDA 214 provide JOUVISOY with most of the information necessary for MARKEL's final briefing; the only other information and action necessary at this time are:
 - a. On receipt of this dispatch, to cable luxembourg the alias to be used by CRICIAND if she meets MANIAL.
- Luxuebourg to include in the briefing to MARKEL the statement that if GRICKIRD wants to get bold of him, she will telephone him between 0830 and 0900 hours or between 1700 and 1730 hours at his hotel, La Craix du Sad, vill give him her clies, and will say, "Brigitte wrote to me that you would be here and asked me to shee you around. " MARKEL will reply with a statement of appreciation. He will not contact his usless we plak up something affecting his or his mission.

 - 4. Beference persoraph 4, ADDA 234: MARIEL should be briefed on all the sub-paragraphs, but should be talk to concentrate first on sub-paragraph a, rather then dilute his effort. Unless Station objects, in which case please oable to Luxesbourg with reasons, the brisiles of MARKET abould include the percenthetical note in sub-paragraph c, since this will permit him to take precentionery measures in dealing with these types. We prefer that after he has explored the possibilities offered by sub-paragraph a, he explore those offered by sub-paragraph d. Sub-paragraphs b and a abould be sonsidered last records. Although he will be aware of it from his own normal estivity, MUNEL should be specifically told to be slart to the fast that the circles in which he will be dealing are usually loaded with police informate and that we want him to exercise muximum caution. He should also be told that we do not consider this a mismice be told that we do not consider this also he can be expected. ad infinitum. find the types we need in Dakar, we will look elsewhere. (The operation we have in mind is too sensitive to risk blowing it in this phase, and the search for assets must be conducted with <u>truly</u> minimum risk.)

- 5. JOUVERNY is authorised to provide MARKEL with funds for travel, \$400 for living expenses in Dakar (20 days at \$20 per day), and \$300 for operational expenses. 7/A this total to Eqs., citing Cost Center 1123-1003-1000 and cite this dispetch as authority. (On his return he need submit only the airline ticket stub, botal bills, and accounting for the \$300 operational expenses only. These should be sent to EUTURS/D only.) If he needs more funds in ______ he can obtain them ?? ||0 there from CRICHARD. His travel reservations should be made from Frankfurt, but under no aircumstances from luxembourg or Paris. JOUVEROY is authorised to give him monsy for travel to Frankfurt for this purpose. (We will decide on his return how much to pay him for his time on the mission.)
- 6. If there are any questions on the part of or Luxeabourg, please cable to each other, with info to Eqs., or to Eqs. with info to the other station. Cables should refer to this dispatch and be slugged RIRAT LAURICLE ZZACORM.
- 7. For In view of the fact that the cover installation is not guarded during off-duty hours, this dispatch should be reduced to cryptic necessary notes and destroyed after the first reading. MANKAL's picture and all cable traffic, as well as your copies of AUDA 234, should also be destroyed as soon as 72 no longer needed. Secessary notes, i.e., on arrangements for contacts, and MANKAL's picture, until the first contact, should be sealed in such a way that any tampering will be immediately evident.
