- 4. In a report dated 26 April 1964 it was reported that Rogelio RODXIGUEZ Lopez, second secretary of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City, uses the pseudonyms "Chele" and "Gorrin" with his contacts in Mexico.
- 5. On 28 April 1964 it was reported that Rogelio RODRIGUEZ, a known Cuban intelligence service officer, left Mexico for Cuba on 25 April 1964 for a permanent change of station.
- 6. In the 17 May 1964 issue of <u>Hoy</u> it was reported that Rogelio RODRIGUEZ Lopez, second secretary of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City, left Cuba on 16 May 1964 to return to duty in Mexico.
- 7. A fairly reliable source in a report dated 5 June 1964 stated that Rogelio RODRIGUEZ, second secretary of the Cuban Embassy in Mexico City, is the son of a Communist Party member and that he (RODRIGUEZ) previously worked in the Foreign Office on Mexican matters in the Latin American Political Department. Source also said that he thought RODRIGUEZ probably worked for Manuel PINEIRO.
