~~XXXXXXXXXX~~ AMT/1 - Photograph Identifications

Action Required: None; for your information.

AMT/1 was unable to identify photographs of Juan Francisco RIVERO, Consuelo Angelica YLLASO de Mendez and Gerardo Antonio PARRALES BENA.

2. Source recognized a photograph of Edivas LORA Siente and believes that this individual arrived in ~~XXXXXX~~ with a group of some fifteen Dominicans. The Source saw this group while in training school, and the best recollection was that LORA was still in ~~XXXXXX~~ when AMT/1 left (April 1964) because documentation for onward travel had not been prepared.

3. AMT/1 also recognized a photograph of Jose GILLES Lezono but does not recall seeing pertinent data concerning him. Source does believe that he knows this individual as a Cuban rather than a Dominican, although the latter is not excluded. Source commented that if he is a Dominican, he would have been in ~~XXXXXX~~ after August 1961, because it was at that time that Source began working for the ~~XXXXXX~~ Intelligence Service.

4. With respect to SILVANO LORA Vicente, [redacted] reported that Subject returned to the Dominican Republic on 11 September 1963 (see HDCA-3525 of 26 January 1964).

5. Jose CASSA Lagrone returned to the Dominican Republic on 22 August 1963 and was deported on 8 October 1963, returning again to the Dominican Republic on 27 November 1963.

6. The photographs of LORA and CASSA which were shown to [redacted] were received from the Barbados Police in August 1963.
